

4. Notwithstanding the provisions of the last preceding section, any person may gather olives before the date so fixed, provided that he gives notice in writing of his intention so to do to the Mukhtar of the village or, in his absence, to a member of the Village Commission.

Conditions under which olives can be gathered before date.

Every such notice shall state approximately the quantity of olives intended to be gathered, and the situation of the trees from which the olives are to be gathered.

5. Nothing in this Law contained shall be taken to prevent the collection of olives, which have fallen from the trees, by the owner or other person entitled to collect them.

Windfallen olives.

6. Any person who, between two hours after sunset and two hours before sunrise, without having given previous notice to the Mukhtar or to a member of the Village Commission in the manner hereinbefore in this Law provided, gathers olives, whether before or after the date fixed for the gathering of the olive crop, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one pound.

Prohibition against gathering at night.

7. Any person who between the hours specified in the last preceding section carries or conveys any olives, carobs, sheaves, or other cereal produce shall, unless and until he proves that he has obtained possession of the same lawfully, be deemed to be in unlawful possession thereof, and shall be liable to the fine provided by the last preceding section.
