CHAPTER 194A Military Uniforms (Prohibition) Act

An Act to prohibit the wearing, importation and sale of military uniforms.

[Act No. 9 of 2000.]

[8th March, 2000.]

1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the Military Uniforms (Prohibition) Act.

2. Definitions

In this Act—

"authorised persons" means a member of the Royal Grenada Police Force or a member of a *bona fide* foreign military force or police force on a visit to Grenada;

"military" includes police;

"military uniforms" means combat camouflage or other distinctive dress generally worn by members of the Royal Grenada Police Force or any other police or military force and includes any wearing apparel designed to resemble such dress or any part thereof but does not include footwear;

"minister" means the Minister responsible for national security;

"Royal Grenada Police Force" means the Royal Grenada Police Force established by section 3 of the Police Act, Chapter 244.
