PART I. Introductory

1. This Act may be cited as the Civil Aviation Act.

Short title.

2.—(1) In this Act—

- "aerodrome" means any area of land or water designed, equipped, set apart or commonly used for affording facilities for the landing and departure of aircraft;
- "aircraft" means any machine that can derive support in the 18/2004. atmosphere from the reactions of the air, other than the reactions of the air against the earth's surface, and includes a rocket:

- "air transport service" means a service for the carriage by air of passengers, mails or other freight;

"aviation document" means any licence, certificate or other 18/2004. document issued under or pursuant to this Act in respect of any person, undertaking or thing;

(2) Any power conferred by this Act shall be in addition

to and not in derogation of any other power so conferred.
