(SECTION 10(1))

*[Commencement 20th December, 1952]*

1. These Rules may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs (Dispensing of Narcotics) Rules. Citation.
2. In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires — Interpretation.
  - “narcotics” means morphine, opium, codeine, heroin, cocaine and their salts;
  - “pharmacist” means a person licensed under the Pharmacy Act. Ch. 227.
3. Every pharmacist shall keep a register to be termed a Narcotic Register in the manner specified in the Schedule to these Rules wherein shall be entered each purchase from such pharmacist of a narcotic. Register of narcotics dispensed Schedule.
4. Each such entry in the register shall state the date and number of any prescription for a narcotic, the name of the individual for whom any such narcotic is prescribed, the total quantity of narcotic contained in any such prescription, and the name of the prescribing physician. Entries in register.
5. Each dispensing chemist shall keep all narcotics in a cupboard or other similar receptacle which shall be specially provided for the purpose and which shall be locked. Narcotics to be kept in locked cupboard.
