

The Drugs (Supplementary Provisions) Ordinance, 1986

( Ordinance NO. XIII OF 1986 )

**An Ordinance to make supplementary provisions relating to certain medicines.**

WHEREAS it is expedient to make supplementary provisions relating to certain medicines;

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the President is pleased to make and promulgate the following Ordinance: -

Short title	1. This Ordinance may be called the Drugs (Supplementary Provisions) Ordinance, 1986.
Export of certain medicines	<div>2. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in section 8(2)(a) of the Drugs (Control) Ordinance, 1982 (VIII of 1982), hereinafter referred to as the said Ordinance, all medicines which were required to be destroyed under that section but have not been destroyed for any reason may, with the prior permission of the Government, be exported outside the country within a period of three months from the date of commencement of this Ordinance.</div> <div>(2) All medicines which may be exported under sub-section (1) but are not exported within the period specified therein shall stand forfeited to the Government and may be disposed of by the Government in such manner as it deems fit.</div>
Surrender of medicines	3. Any person in possession of medicines, which were required to be destroyed under section 8 (2)(a) of the said Ordinance, but which have neither been destroyed thereunder nor exported under section 2, shall surrender the medicines to the Government, or to any person authorised
