**PART I - WRECKS AND SALVAGE**

**§701. Short Title.**

This Chapter may be cited as the Investigations - Wrecks and Salvage Act.

**§702. International agreements as to derelicts.**

The President is hereby authorized to make international agreements with governments interested for the reporting, marking and removing of dangerous wrecks, derelicts and other menaces to navigation in the Central Pacific Region outside the coastal waters bordering the Republic.
