THE STANDARDS OF WEIGHT ACT, 1939

¹ACT No. IX OF 1939

[28th March, 1939]

An Act to establish standards of weight throughout ²[Pakistan]

WHEREAS it is expedient to establish standards of weight throughout ²[Pakistan];

It is hereby enacted as follows:—

- **1. Short title, extent and commencement.**—(1) This Act may be called the Standards of Weight Act, 1939.
 - ³[(2) It extends to the whole of Pakistan.]
- (3) It shall come into force on such date⁴ as the ⁵[Federal Government] may, by notification in the official Gazette, appoint.
- **2.** Unit for weight.—(1) The unit for weight shall be the standard grain, that is to say, that weight which when multiplied by 1799.84585 is the weight *in vacuo* of the iridio-platinum cylinder in the custody of the ⁶[Mint Master, Lahore], certified by the Standards Department of the British Board of Trade as having a weight of 1799.84585 grains *in vacuo*.
- (2) The standard grain shall be the only unit from which all other standard weights shall be ascertained.
 - **3. Standard weights.** (1) There shall be the following standard weights, namely :-
 - (a) the standard tola, being a weight of 180 standard grains;
