AN ACT SEPARATING THE TANUDAN VOCATIONAL SCHOOL –
TALOCTOC ANNEX IN BARANGAY TALOCTOC, MUNICIPALITY OF
TANUDAN, PROVINCE OF KALINGA FROM THE TANUDAN
VOCATIONAL SCHOOL, CONVERTING IT INTO AN INDEPENDENT
NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL TO BE KNOWN AS TALOCTOC GENERAL
COMPREHENSIVE NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL AND
APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Separation and Conversion into a National High School. – The Tanudan Vocational School – Taloctoc Annex in Barangay Taloctoc, Municipality of Tanudan, Province of Kalinga is hereby separated from the Tanudan Vocational School and converted into an independent national high school to be known as Taloctoc General Comprehensive National High School.

- SEC. 2. *Transfer of Assets and Liabilities.* All personnel, assets, liabilities and records of the Tanudan Vocational School Taloctoc Annex are hereby transferred to and absorbed by the Taloctoc General Comprehensive National High School.
- SEC. 3. Appropriations. The Secretary of Education shall immediately include in the Department's program the operationalization of the Taloctoc General Comprehensive National High School, the initial funding of which shall be charged against the current year's appropriations of the Tanudan Vocational School Taloctoc Annex. Thereafter, the amount necessary for the continued operation of the school shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.
- SEC. 4. *Implementation.* The Secretary of Education shall issue such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the purpose of this Act.
- SEC. 5. *Effectivity.* This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official Gazette*.
