

[REPUBLIC ACT NO. 6414, October 04, 1971]

AN ACT AMENDING SECTION TWENTY-ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY-FOUR OF THE REVISED ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, AS AMENDED BY REPUBLIC ACT NUMBERED FORTY-THREE HUNDRED AND FIFTY-EIGHT, BY INCREASING THE MAXIMUM LIMIT OF SALARIES OF MUNICIPAL OFFICERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Section twenty-one hundred and eighty-four of the Revised Administrative Code as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 2184. *Salaries of municipal officers.*— (A) Except as otherwise specially provided herein, the annual salaries of municipal officers in first class, second class, and third class municipalities are herein below fixed:

"In municipalities of the first class that have obtained during the next preceding two fiscal years an average total annual revenue of two million five hundred thousand pesos or more (First Class-1), For (the Mayor thirteen thousand two hundred pesos; for the Municipal Treasurer, twelve thousand six hundred pesos; for the Municipal secretary and chief of police, six thousand six hundred pesos; and for the chief of municipal fire department, five thousand two hundred and eighty pesos;

"In municipalities of the first class that have obtained during the next preceding two fiscal years an average total annual revenue of one million five hundred thousand pesos or more but less than two million five hundred thousand pesos (First Class-2) : for the Mayor, twelve thousand six hundred pesos; for the Municipal Treasurer, twelve thousand pesos; for the municipal secretary and chief of police, six thousand three hundred pesos.; and for the chief of municipal fire department, five thousand and forty pesos;

In municipalities of the first class that have obtained during the next preceding two fiscal years an average total annual revenue of one million pesos or more but less than one million five hundred thousand pesos (First Class-3): For the Mayor, twelve thousand pesos; for the municipal treasurer, eleven thousand four hundred pesos; for the municipal secretary and the chief of police, six thousand pesos; and for the chief of municipal fire department, four thousand eight hundred pesos;

"In municipalities of the first class that have obtained during the next preceding two fiscal years an average total annual revenue of seven hundred thousand pesos or more but less than one million pesos (First Class-4); For the Mayor, eleven thousand four hundred pesos; for the municipal treasurer, ten thousand eight hundred pesos; for the municipal

secretary and the chief of police, five thousand seven hundred pesos; and for the chief of municipal fire department, four thousand five hundred and sixty pesos;

"In municipalities of the first class that have obtained during the next preceding two fiscal years an average total annual revenue of five hundred thousand pesos or more but less than seven hundred thousand pesos (First Class-5) : For the Mayor, ten thousand eight hundred pesos; for municipal treasurer, ten thousand two hundred pesos; for the municipal secretary and the chief of police, five thousand four hundred pesos; and for the chief of the municipal fire department, four thousand three hundred and twenty pesos;

"In municipalities of the first class with an average total annual revenue of three hundred thousand pesos or more but less than five hundred thousand pesos during the next preceding two fiscal years (First Class-6): the Mayor, ten thousand two hundred pesos; for the municipal treasurer, nine thousand six hundred pesos; for the municipal secretary and the chief of police, five thousand one hundred pesos; and for the chief of municipal fire department, four thousand one hundred and forty pesos;

"In municipalities of the second class that have obtained during the next preceding two fiscal years an average total annual revenue of two hundred thousand pesos or more but less than three hundred thousand pesos: For the Mayor, nine thousand six hundred pesos; for the municipal treasurer, nine thousand pesos; for the municipal secretary and the chief of police, four thousand eight hundred pesos; and for the chief of the municipal fire department, three thousand nine hundred and sixty pesos; and

"In municipalities of the third class that have obtained during the next preceding two fiscal years an average total annual revenue of one hundred thousand pesos or more but less than two hundred thousand pesos: For the Mayor, nine thousand pesos; for the municipal treasurer, eight thousand four hundred pesos; for the municipal secretary and the chief of police, four thousand five hundred pesos; and for the chief of the municipal fire department, three thousand eight hundred and forty pesos;

"(B) Subject to the provisions of the last paragraph hereof, the annual salaries of municipal officers in municipalities below third class are herein-below fixed:

"In municipalities of the fourth class: for the Mayor, eight thousand four hundred pesos; for the municipal treasurer, seven thousand eight hundred pesos; for the municipal secretary and the chief of police, four thousand two hundred pesos; and for the chief of municipal fire department, three thousand six hundred pesos;

"In municipalities of the fifth class: For the Mayor, seven thousand eight hundred pesos; for the municipal treasurer, six thousand nine hundred
