[REPUBLIC ACT NO. 3224, June 17, 1961]

AN ACT AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NUMBERED TWENTY-THREE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN, ENTITLED" AN ACT GRANTING THE TAGGAT SAWMILL COMPANY, INC., A TEMPORARY PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT MAINTAIN AND OPERATE PRIVATE FIXED POINT-TO-POINT AND LAND BASED RADIO STATIONS FOR THE RECEPTION AND TRANSMISSION OF RADIO COMMUNICATIONS WITHIN THE PHILIPPINES."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Section one of Republic Act Numbered Twenty-three hundred and eleven is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SECTION 1. Subject to the provisions of the Constitution as well as of Act Numbered Three thousand eight hundred forty-six, entitled "An Act providing for the regulation of radio stations and radio communications in the Philippine Islands, and for other purposes," Act Numbered Three thousand nine hundred ninety-seven, known as the Radio Broadcasting Law; Commonwealth Act Numbered One hundred and forty-six, known as the Public Service Act, and their amendments, and other applicable laws, not inconsistent with this Act, there is hereby 'granted to the Taggat Industries, its successor or assigns, a temporary permit to construct, operate and maintain in the Philippines, at such places as the said company may select and the Secretary of Public Works Communications may approve, private fixed point-to-point and land based radio stations for the reception and transmission of wireless messages on radiotelegraphy and/or radiotelephony, each station to be provided "with radio transmitting apparatus and radio receiving apparatus."

SEC. 2. The title of said Act is amended to read as follows:

"An Act granting the Taggat Industries, a temporary permit to construct, maintain and operate private fixed point-to-point and land based radio stations for the reception and transmission of radio communications within the Philippines."
