

[REPUBLIC ACT NO. 3198, June 17, 1961]

AN ACT GRANTING JOAQUIN BOCANEGRA A FRANCHISE FOR AN ELECTRIC LIGHT, HEAT AND POWER SYSTEM AND AN ICE PLANT AND COLD STORAGE IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF AMLA, PROVINCE OF NEGROS ORIENTAL, AND TO DISTRIBUTE AND SELL LIGHT, HEAT AND/OR POWER AND ICE AND SUPPLY COLD STORAGE THEREIN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Subject to the terms and conditions established in this Act and in Act Numbered Thirty-six hundred and thirty-six, as amended by Commonwealth Act Numbered One hundred and thirty-two; Commonwealth Act Numbered forty-six, as amended, and to the provisions of the Constitution, there is granted to Joaquin Bocanegra for a period of twenty-five years from the approval of this Act, the right, privilege and authority to construct, maintain and operate an electric light, heat and power system for the purpose of generating and distributing electric light, heat and/or power, and an ice plant and cold storage for the purpose of manufacturing and distributing ice and supplying cold storage in the Municipality of Amlan, Province of Negros Oriental, and to charge and collect a schedule of prices and rates for the electricity and ice and cold storage so furnished, which schedule of prices and rates shall at all times be subject to regulation by the Public Service Commission.

SEC. 2. In the event that the grantee shall purchase and secure from the National Power Corporation electric heat and power, the National Power Corporation is hereby authorized to negotiate and transact for the benefit and in behalf of the public consumers with reference to rates.

SEC. 3. The grantee shall manufacture and supply ice and cold storage up to the limit of the capacity of his plant, said limit to be determined by the Public Service Commission.

SEC. 4. All the apparatus and appurtenances to be used by the grantee shall be modern, safe and first class in every respect, and the grantee shall, whenever the Public Service Commission shall determine that public interest reasonably requires it, change or alter any of his apparatus and appurtenances at grantee's expense.

SEC. 5. If the grantee shall not commence operation within one year from the approval of this Act, unless prevented by an act of God or *force majeure*, martial law, riot, civil commotion, or any other cause beyond the grantee's control, this franchise shall become null and void.
