

[EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 91, February 05, 1946]

FIXING NEW CEILING PRICES OF ALL COMMODITIES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, it has become necessary to revise and issue a new schedule of ceiling prices during the present emergency in view of changed conditions in trade and commerce; and

WHEREAS, the public interest requires that a reasonable schedule of ceiling prices be established and fixed for all articles, commodities and services;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SERGIO OSMEÑA, President of the Philippines, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Constitution and existing laws of the Philippines, do hereby order:

SECTION 1. The following essential commodities shall not be sold at more than the maximum retail prices set opposite each:

SEC. 2. For articles or commodities not specified above and whose prices have not been specifically determined, following maximum retailer's mark-ups over landed cost a hereby prescribed and promulgated:
