Citation

1. These Regulations may be cited as the National Cadet Corps Service Medal Regulations.

Definitions

- 2. In these Regulations
 - "officer" means an officer, honorary officer or honorary instructor appointed under section 9 of the Act;
 - "qualifying service" means service as an officer, honorary officer or honorary instructor with the Corps;
 - "service in the Corps" means active involvement in "open" or "school" units of the Corps.

Eligibility for award of Medal

3.—(1) The National Cadet Corps Service Medal (referred to in these Regulations as the Medal) may be awarded to any officer in recognition of his good and efficient service in the Corps.

(2) Any officer who on or after 1st January 1978 has completed 5 years' continuous service, or periods of service amounting in the aggregate to not less than 5 years, shall be eligible for the Medal:

Provided that his attendance has been regular.

(3) Any period of service with the Singapore Armed Forces or the Singapore Police Force or any other service shall not count towards qualifying service.

(4) Notwithstanding paragraph (3), any period of service with the Corps as a Cadet-Lieutenant shall count towards qualifying service for the purpose of paragraph (2).

Award by Minister on recommendation of Council

4.—(1) The Medal shall be awarded by the Minister for Education on the recommendation of the Council. The recommendation shall be submitted to the Minister in the month of March each year.

(2) The names of the officers to whom the Medal is awarded shall be published in the National Cadet Corps General Orders, and a register of such names shall be kept in the office of the Director-General of Education.
