**PINGAT PENTADBIRAN AWAM (TENTERA) —
(THE PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION MEDAL —**

MILITARY) RULES 1981

It is hereby notified for general information that the President having been pleased to approve the institution of a medal to be styled the Pingat Pentadbiran Awam (Tentera) or “the Public Administration Medal (Military)” hereby makes the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Pingat Pentadbiran Awam (Tentera) — (the Public Administration Medal — Military) Rules 1981 and shall come into operation on the 7th day of August, 1981.

2. In these Rules, “member of the Singapore Armed Forces” means any person who is rendering —

- (a) full-time service in the Singapore Armed Forces whether regular, mobilized or national service;
- (b) voluntary service in the division of the Singapore Armed Forces known as the People’s Defence Forces; or
- (c) reserve service in the Singapore Armed Forces.

3.—(1) The Medal may be awarded to any member of the Singapore Armed Forces who has distinguished himself through meritorious service in military command or staff work.

(2) There shall be 3 grades of the Medal as follows:—

- (a) the Public Administration Medal (Gold) (Military);
- (b) the Public Administration Medal (Silver) (Military); and
- (c) the Public Administration Medal (Bronze) (Military).

4. The Medal shall be brass-based, 45 millimetres in length, 40 millimetres in width and 3 millimetres in thickness. The Medal shall be of a star-studded white enamel surrounding an oval-shaped medallion with a three-dimensional tri-service design centrally located on it. The medallion is supported by laurels. All the metallic portions and the stars surrounding the Medal will be in gold, silver or bronze, as the case may be.

5. The name of the recipient and the date of the award shall be inscribed on the back of the Medal.

5A.—(1) Where a member of the Singapore Armed Forces who has previously been awarded the Medal performs any special act or service for which he deserves to be awarded a Medal of the same grade, but not of a higher grade, as that which he has been awarded, he may be awarded a Bar to a Medal of that grade.

(2) A member of the Singapore Armed Forces shall not be awarded more than one
