An Act to amend certain Statutes of the Republic of Singapore.

Be it enacted by the President with the advice and consent of the Parliament of Singapore, as follows: —

**Short title**

1. This Act may be cited as the Statutes of the Republic of Singapore (Miscellaneous Amendments) (No. 3) Act, 1973.

### Miscellaneous amendments

2. The provisions of the Acts specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Act are hereby amended in the manner set out in the second column thereof with effect from the dates shown against them in the third column thereof.

#### THE SCHEDULE

(a) The High Court (Admiralty Jurisdiction) Act (Chapter 6)		
Section 3(4)(a)	Delete the word “of” appearing in the third line thereof and substitute therefor the word “or”	1st March, 1971.
(b) The Subordinate Courts Act (Chapter 14)		
Section 2 (definition of “action”)	Delete the expression “Rues of Court” appearing therein and substitute therefor the words “Rules of Court”	1st March, 1971.
(c) The Debtors Act (Chapter 19)		
Section 24(9)	Delete the word “other” appearing at the end thereof and substitute therefor the word “order”	1st March, 1971.
(d) The Administration of Muslim Law Act (Chapter 42)		
Section 2	Delete the words “and Divorces” appearing in the definition of “Registrar” therein	1st March, 1971.
(e) The Women’s Charter (Chapter 47)		
Section 22(4)	Delete and substitute therefor the following: —  “(4) If either party does not understand the English language, the Registrar shall, at the time of solemnization, interpret or cause to be interpreted to	1st March, 1971.
