AN ACT TO ESTABLISH AN ELECTORAL BOUNDARIES COMMISSION TO DEFINE THE BOUNDARIES OF ELECTORAL CONSTITUENCIES AND KEEP THOSE BOUNDARIES UNDER REVIEW¹

Commencement [6th May 2010]

PART 1 - PRELIMINARY

1 Short title

This Act may be cited as the Electoral Boundaries Commission Act.

2 Interpretation

In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires —

"census" means a national population census made under section 8 of the Statistics Act²:

"Commission" means the Electoral Boundaries Commission established by section 3;

"island group" means one of the following —

- (a) Tongatapu;
- (b) Vava'u;
- (c) Ha'apai;
- (d) 'Eua;
