

INDUSTRIAL TRAINING**Engineering Industry Training Board**

ORDER, DATED 30TH JULY 1973, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER THE INDUSTRIAL TRAINING ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1964.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services, on behalf of the Secretary of State, after consultation with the Engineering Industry Training Board and with organisations and associations of organisations appearing to it to be representative respectively of substantial numbers of employers engaging in the activities hereinafter mentioned and of substantial numbers of persons employed in those activities and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 10 of the Industrial Training Act (Northern Ireland) 1964(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Industrial Training (Engineering Board) Order (Northern Ireland) 1973 and shall come into operation on 1st August 1973.

(2) In this Order—

“the Act” means the Industrial Training Act (Northern Ireland) 1964;

“the Board” means the Engineering Industry Training Board;

“levy Order” includes the Industrial Training Levy (Engineering Industry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1965(b), the Industrial Training Levy (Engineering Industry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1966(c), the Industrial Training Levy (Engineering Industry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1967(d), the Industrial Training Levy (Engineering Industry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1968(e), the Industrial Training Levy (Engineering Industry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1969(f), the Industrial Training Levy (Engineering Industry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1970(g), the Industrial Training Levy (Engineering Industry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1971(h) and the Industrial Training Levy (Engineering Industry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1972(i);

“the 1967 Order” means the Industrial Training (Engineering Board) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1967(j);

“the principal Order” means the Industrial Training (Engineering Board) Order (Northern Ireland) 1964(k);

Revocation

2. The 1967 Order is hereby revoked.

Activities of the Board

3. The activities in relation to which the Board exercises the functions conferred by the Act upon industrial training boards shall, in lieu of the activities specified in Schedule 1 to the principal Order (as amended by the 1967 Order) be the activities specified in the Schedule to this Order, and accordingly in the principal Order the latter Schedule shall be substituted for the former Schedule.

Transitional provisions

4.—(1) The Chairman and other members of the Board on the day upon which this Order comes into operation shall continue to be members of the Board and to hold and vacate their offices in accordance with the terms of the instruments appointing them to be members.

(2) The provisions of this Order shall not—

- (a) extend the operation of a levy Order;
- (b) affect the operation of a levy Order in relation to the assessment of an employer within the meaning of that Order in respect of an establishment that was engaged in the relevant levy period wholly or mainly in activities included in the Schedule to this Order;
- (c) affect the operation of any assessment notice served by the Board under the provisions of a levy Order before the day upon which this Order comes into operation or any appeal or other proceedings arising out of any such notice.

SCHEDULE

The Engineering Industry

1. Subject to the provisions of this Schedule, the activities of the engineering industry are the following activities in so far as they are carried out in Northern Ireland:—

- (a) the quarrying or mining of iron ore or the treatment or preparation of iron ore for smelting;
- (b) the smelting of iron ore in a blast furnace with or without other metal-liferous materials, or the production of iron by any other process;
- (c) the production of steel by any process;
- (d) when carried out in association with any of the foregoing activities—
 - (i) the quarrying of limestone;
 - (ii) the production of coke;
 - (iii) the casting of iron or steel by any process;
 - (iv) the production with or without heat of any iron or steel forgings;
 - (v) the annealing or heat treatment of steel;
- (e) the rolling, with or without heat, of iron or steel products for the purpose of reducing the cross-sectional area thereof;
- (f) the production from iron or steel of bright bars, hot finished tubes or hot finished pipes;
- (g) when carried out by an employer (or an associated company of the employer, being a company) mainly engaged in the production of iron or steel and in the production from iron or steel of hot finished tubes or hot finished pipes—
 - (i) the production of cold finished tubes or cold finished pipes;
 - (ii) the manipulation or fabrication of any tubes or pipes;
- (h) the production of tinplate, terneplate, iron or steel wire, or steel wire ropes;
- (i) when carried out in association with any of the foregoing activities the production of galvanised or other coated steel sheets;
- (j) the manufacture of—
 - (i) articles wholly or mainly from metal or a metal carbide;
 - (ii) articles wholly or mainly from any combination of either metal and plastics material or of metal and a metal carbide;
 - (iii) aircraft or hovercraft;
 - (iv) articles embodying a lens or prism;
 - (v) primary cells, batteries or electric accumulators;
 - (vi) electric cables, electric filament lamps, electric discharge lamps or photographic flashbulbs;
 - (vii) thermionic, cold cathode or photo-cathode valves or tubes, cathode-ray tubes or electric capacitors or resistors;
 - (viii) printed or micro-electronic circuits, devices using ferrite or quartz crystals for electrical purposes or semi-conductor or piezo-electric devices;
 - (ix) patterns or models constructed for engineering or metal casting purposes;
- (k) the manufacture or fitting out of vehicle bodies where the employer is engaged in the manufacture of motor vehicles or where the vehicle bodies are manufactured or fitted out to the order of an employer engaged in the manufacture of motor vehicles;
- (l) the installation, testing, inspection or, except in the case of vehicle bodies, the repair of any articles or other products specified in sub-paragraph (j);
- (m) the painting or paint spraying of any articles specified in sub-paragraph (j)(i), (ii), (iii) or (ix);
- (n) the casting in non-ferrous metal (other than gold, silver or platinum) of sculptured figures;

- (o) the following operations or processes, that is to say—
 - (i) the reduction of virgin aluminum, the production of secondary-based aluminium or of aluminium alloys or the manufacture of aluminium powder or paste and, when carried out by an employer engaged substantially in any of the said operations, the production or processing of any other non-ferrous metal;
 - (ii) the smelting or refining of copper or copper alloys;
 - (iii) the rolling, drawing, extruding or forging of non-ferrous metal and, when carried out by an employer engaged substantially in any such operation, any refining of metal incidental thereto;
- (p) the following operations or processes that is to say—
 - (i) any process of metal preparation including mechanical or chemical cleaning;
 - (ii) tempering, case-hardening and annealing or other process of metal treatment;
 - (iii) electro-plating, anodising, polishing, burnishing, vitreous or stove enamelling or other metal finishing process;
- (q) the machining of carbon articles;
- (r) the preparation of engineering drawings;
- (s) the hiring out by an employer of individuals in his employment to persons engaging in any of the foregoing activities, where the said individuals are to be employed in such activities;
- (t) any activities being—
 - (i) related activities incidental or ancillary to principal activities of the engineering industry; or
 - (ii) activities undertaken in the administration, control or direction of one or more establishments, being establishments engaged wholly or mainly in principal activities of that industry, in related activities incidental or ancillary thereto, or in the administration, control or direction of one or more other establishments engaged in such principal or related activities;

and carried out, in either case, by the employer engaged in those principal activities or, where that employer is a company, by the company or by an associated company of the company;
- (u) any activities of industry or commerce (other than engineering activities) carried out at or from an establishment mainly engaged—
 - (i) in engineering activities; or
 - (ii) in engineering activities and in activities described in the Appendix but to a greater extent in engineering activities than in activities described in that Appendix in relation to any one industry.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Schedule, there shall not be included in the activities of the engineering industry:—

- (a) the activities of any establishment engaged—
 - (i) mainly in activities not being engineering activities or activities described in the Appendix; or
 - (ii) to a less extent in engineering activities than in activities described in that Appendix in relation to any one industry;
- (b) the activities of any establishment engaged wholly or mainly in related activities, being activities—
 - (i) incidental or ancillary to the activities of one or more establishments (hereafter referred to as “the principal establishment”) engaged wholly or mainly in any activities not being principal activities of the engineering industry; and
 - (ii) carried out by the employer carrying on the principal establishment or, where that employer is a company, by the company or by an associated company of the company;

- (c) the activities of any establishment engaged wholly or mainly in one or more activities of a kind specified in an entry in the second column of the next following Table (being activities undertaken in relation to all or any of the products comprised in the group specified in the corresponding entry in the third column of that Table) or in two or more of such entries;

1.	Erection.	Steel or other metal framework of buildings, or of structures made wholly or mainly of steel or other metal.
2.	Cutting and bending for the purposes of any operations in building work or civil engineering work.	Reinforcing steel.
3.	Erection, repair or dismantling.	Walls, fencing, hoardings and scaffolding.
4.	Manufacture.	Industrialised building components or sections and prefabricated buildings or sections of buildings, being components, sections, and buildings framed in wood.
5.	Construction on the premises in which they are to be installed and prefabrication elsewhere by the employer engaged in their installation.	Shop, office or similar fittings.
6.	Erection or dismantling.	Exhibition stands.
7.	Installation, testing, inspection, maintenance or repair.	Contractors' plant.
8.	Hiring out.	Contractors' plant or scaffolding.
9.	Preparation.	Drawings for the purpose of the construction of the hull of a ship.
10.	Dealing by a merchant or factor.	Building, plumbing, decorating, heating, ventilating or air-conditioning materials or equipment, in architectural and builders' ironmongery or in cloakroom fittings, where such products are supplied to persons engaging in any activities specified in paragraph 2(d).
11.	The operations following when carried out at or from a yard, a dry dock (including the precincts thereof), a harbour or a wet dock—	
	(a) construction, fitting out, reconstruction, repair, refitting, painting or finishing.	Ships and floating constructions.
	(b) scaling, scurfing or cleaning.	Ships' boilers.
	(c) scaling, chipping or shot blasting.	Ships' hulls.
	(d) shot blasting.	Ships' tanks.
