PLANNING (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER 1972

Appointed Day

Order, dated 6th July 1973, made by the Secretary of State under Article 1(2) of the Planning (Northern Ireland) Order 1972

In exercise of the power conferred upon me by section 1(1) of the Northern Ireland (Temporary Provisions) Act 1972(a) and Article 1(2) of the Planning (Northern Ireland) Order 1972(b) (hereinafter referred to as "the Planning Order") I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Planning (Northern Ireland) Order 1972 (Appointed Day) Order (Northern Ireland) 1973.

2. Paragraph (1) of Article 2, and Articles 82, 88, 89, 90 and 100, and Schedules 2 and 3 of the Planning Order shall come into operation on the 9th July 1973.

3. The remainder of the Planning Order, in so far as it is not already in operation, shall come into operation on 1st October 1973.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order brings into operation on 9th July 1973 various provisions of the Planning (Northern Ireland) Order 1972, in particular those enabling the Historic Buildings Council and the Planning Appeals Commission to be established. It also provides for the remainder of the Planning (Northern Ireland) Order 1972 to come into operation on 1st October 1973.
