PART I

Preliminary

1 This Act may be cited as the National Forensic Act, 2020,
5 and shall come into operation on the date appointed by the Minister by statutory instrument.

- (b) an officer of the Office of State Forensic Pathologist;

- (f) an officer from the Zambia Correctional Service;
- (g) an officer from the Defence Force; and
- (h) any other person appointed in writing by the Minister;

- "ballistic fingerprint" means a unique mark a gun makes on a bullet or the bullets shell casing;
- "biometric" means the measurement and statistical analysis of a human being's unique physical and behavioural 15 characteristics:
- "Board" means the National Forensic Board constituted under section 5;
- "bodily sample" means intimate or buccal samples taken from a person; 20
- "buccal sample" means a sample of cellular material taken from the inside of a person's mouth;
- "Chairperson" means the person appointed as Chairperson of the Board under section 5;
- "crime scene sample" means physical evidence which is 25 retrieved from a crime scene or any other place where the evidence of a crime may be found, and includes physical evidence collected from the body of a person;
- "Department" means the National Forensic Science and Biometrics Department established under section 27; 30
- "Emoluments Commission" has the meaning assigned to the words in the Constitution;
- "Executive Director" means the person appointed as Executive Director of the Authority under section 7;
