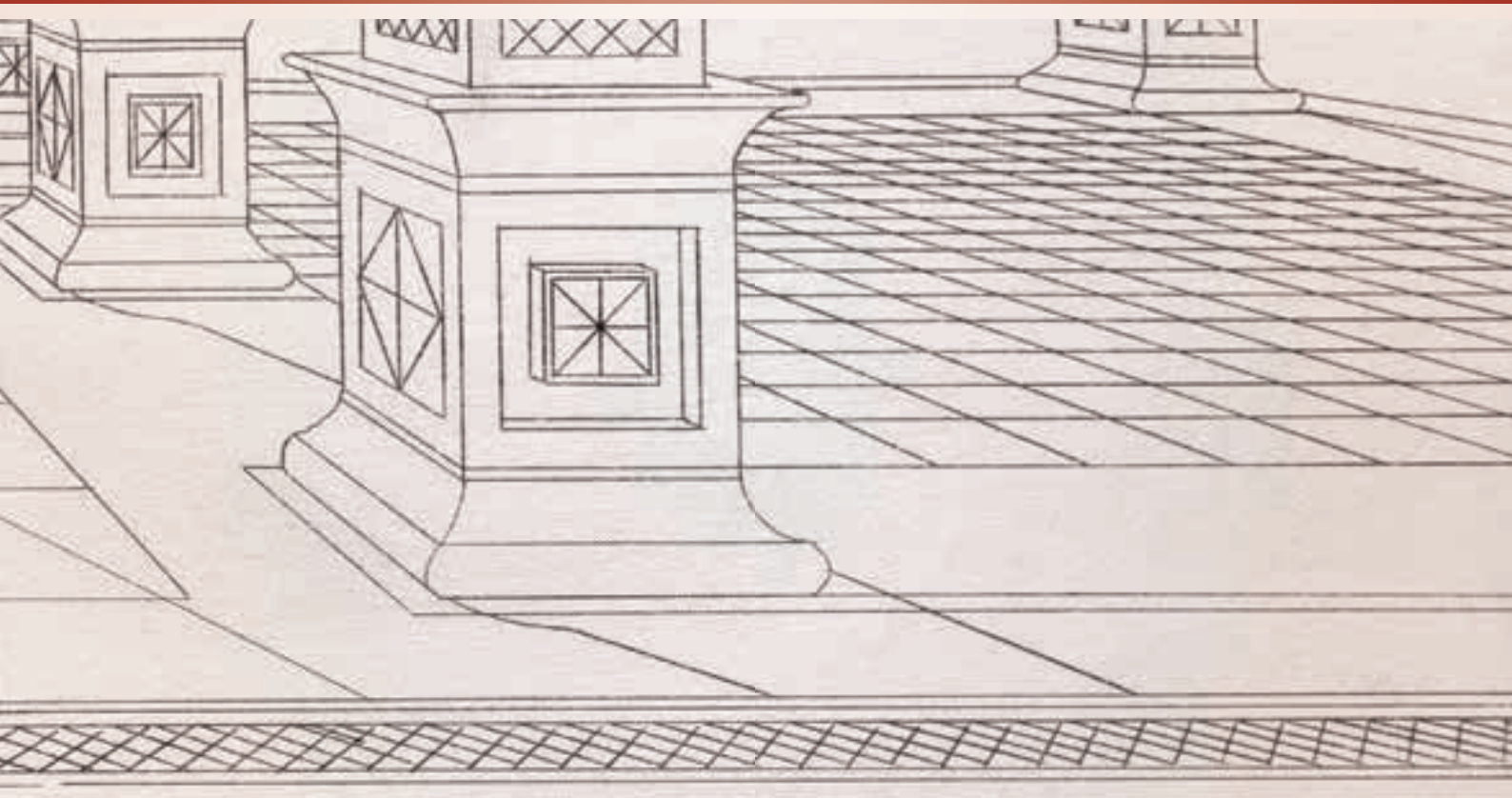

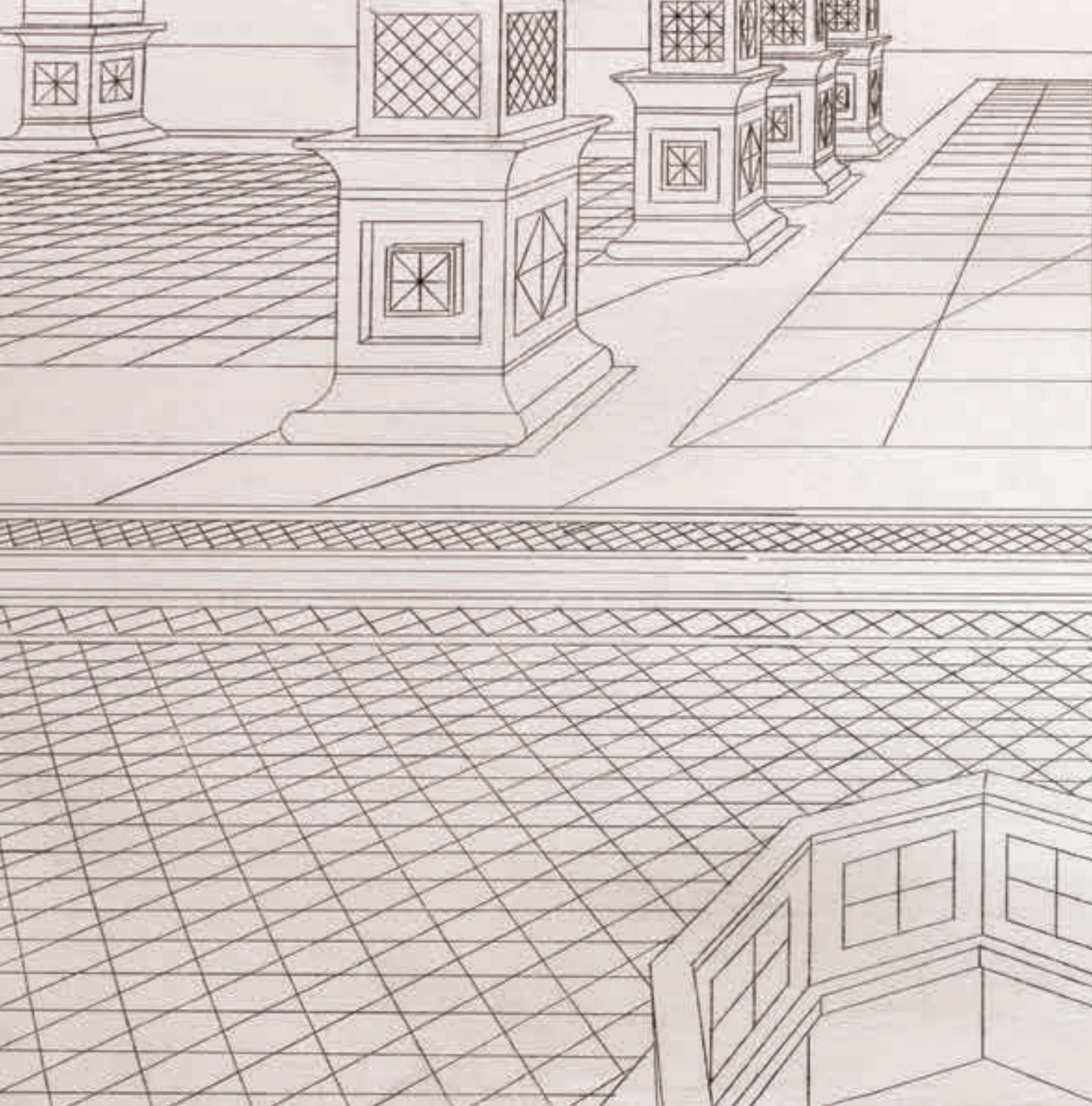

“Mazzarello - geometrie del dare, nuovo futuro” is the work of Maurizio Cancelli.

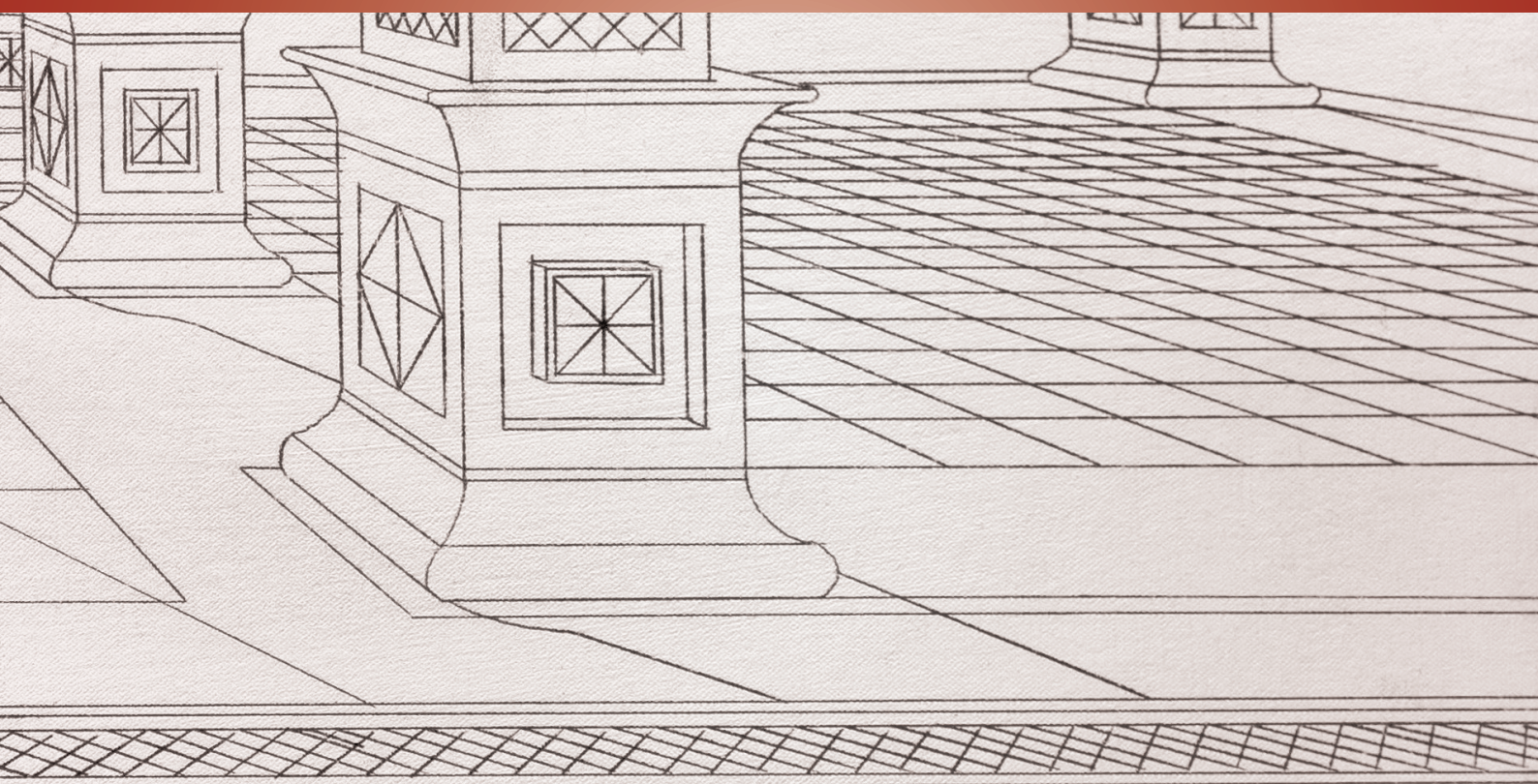
