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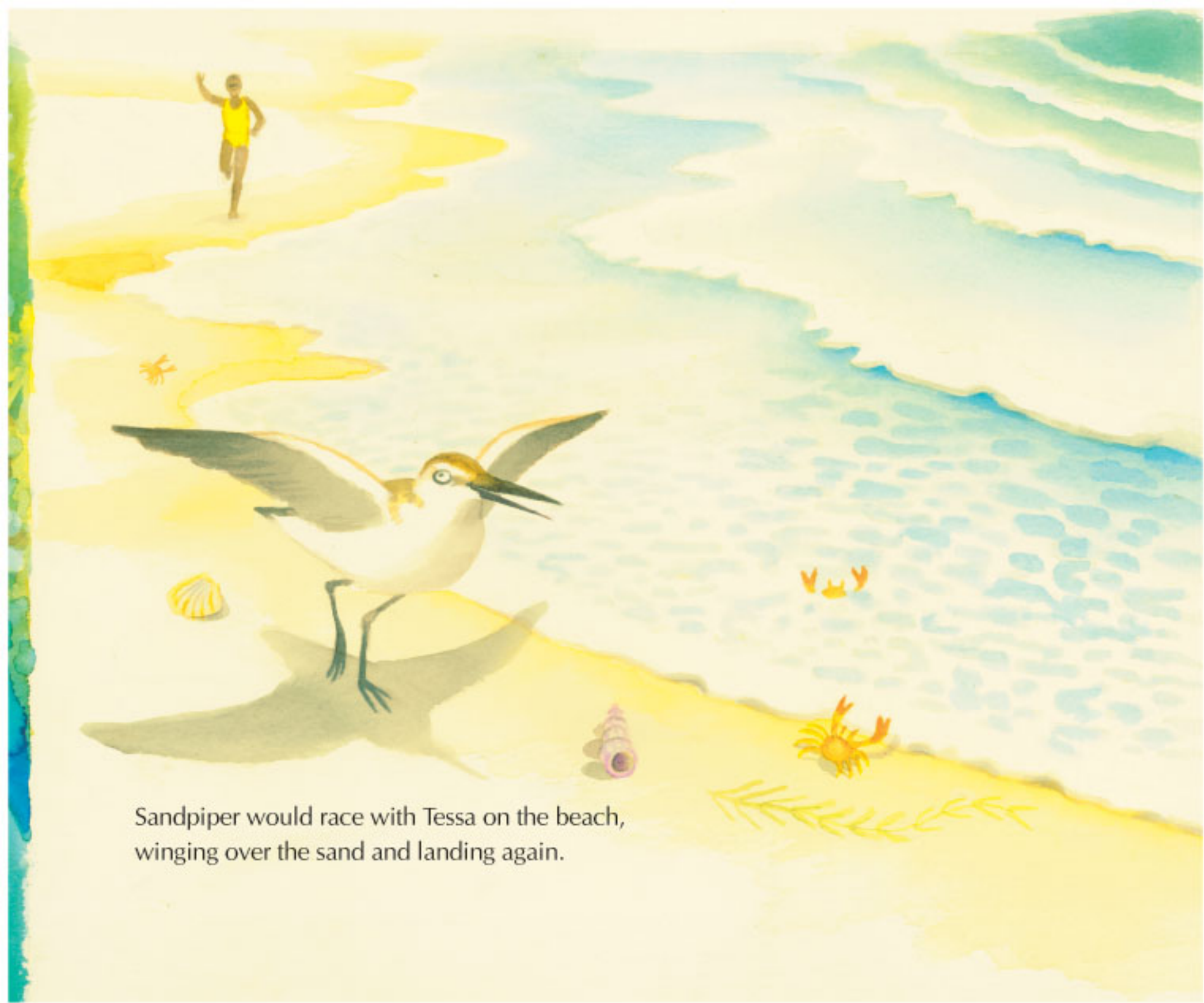


Tessa loved living near the seashore. Each day after school she'd run down to the sparkling white beach, eager to play with her sea friends.
