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1. INFORMATION FOR THOSE TRAVELLING TO KENYA

1. General Information

Kenya is located on the eastern coast of Africa, right on the equator. It is a land of striking landscapes, ranging from snow-capped Mount Kenya to rich farmlands, barren deserts and tropical beaches. It borders Somalia, Ethiopia and Sudan in the north, Uganda in the west, Tanzania in the south, and the Indian Ocean in the east. Kenya's capital city is Nairobi. Other major cities are Mombasa, the main port on the Indian Ocean and Kisumu on Lake Victoria. The eight provinces of Kenya range in geographical size from the small Nairobi Province to the much larger eastern and Rift Valley provinces. Kenya's national parks are wildlife, marine and botanical sanctuaries set aside to conserve their unique species and for educational and recreational enjoyment by Kenyans and tourists.

2. Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (JKIA)

A major fire has destroyed a large section of the airport on 7 August 2013 which affected the operational functions massively. While operations have resumed with both domestic and international departure and arrival functions operational you may still experience some level of discomfort and delays during travel. Please confirm your flight schedules with your respective airline before making your way to the airport. UNEP will support you as best as possible.

3. Time Zone

Kenya is GMT + 0300 hours.

4. Visas

Please be reminded that it is the delegates own responsibility to obtain a visa and that UNEP only provides this information as a guide. If you are unsure about your visa requirements please contact your relevant embassy.

A valid passport, not expiring for at least six months, is required for entry into Kenya. A valid entry visa is also required and may be obtained in advance from the Kenyan Embassy or High Commission in your country of residence. In the absence of either, the British Embassy will generally represent Kenya in the issuance of visas. Please note that visas are not required by citizens of Bahamas, Bangladesh, Barbados, Botswana, Brunei-Darussalam, Cyprus, Dominica, Ethiopia, Fiji, Gambia, Ghana, Grenada, Jamaica, Kiribati, Lesotho, Malawi, Maldives, Mauritius, Namibia, Nauru, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, San Marino, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, Singapore, Solomon Islands, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Swaziland, Tonga, Turkey, Tuvalu, Uganda, United Republic of Tanzania, Uruguay, Vanuatu, Zambia or Zimbabwe.

Visas can also be obtained upon arrival. The fee is US\$50. Nationals of the following countries require special advance visa clearance by the Kenyan authorities (as of July 2010): Afghanistan, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Cameroon, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Iran (Islamic Republic of), Iraq, Lebanon, Libyan Arab Jamahiriya, Mali, Nigeria, Pakistan, Senegal, Somalia, Tajikistan and Yemen. Stateless persons also require advance clearance.

5. Health

A yellow fever vaccination certificate is mandatory for travelers coming from countries where yellow fever may occur, which include Angola, Benin, Bolivia, Brazil, Cameroon, Colombia, Ecuador, Democratic Republic of Congo, Gabon, Gambia, Guinea, Guinea Bissau, Liberia, Peru, Sierra Leone and Sudan. Immunization against yellow fever is recommended for travelers from other countries. Malaria risk exists throughout the year in Kenya, though there is little risk in Nairobi and the highlands. Any medical costs incurred during their stay in Kenya shall be borne by the meeting participants; it is therefore strongly recommended that the participants arrange for their own health insurance. See *21. Emergency Numbers* which includes numbers of nearby hospitals.

6. Security

Participants are expected to look for their own security. UNEP or any other UN agency cannot be held responsible in case an incidence occurs. If you intend to stay in a hotel, you are strongly advised to choose from those in the recommended list of hotels. Kindly read and follow the below attached rules for your own security.

- Keep to the main streets and do not be tempted to go to places of which you are not sure.
- Keep to the main roads and avoid shortcuts down back alleys and the like.
- Never walk at night in the city center even for a short distance – always take a taxi.
- Be particularly wary of people hanging outside hotels; it is a favorite place to catch tourists and mug them.
- Ignore street children and people coming up to you in the streets with hard-luck tales. They may be pickpockets or part of an elaborate scam. The best thing to do is just to walk on and ignore them.
- Do not carry large sums of money when shopping, and do not wear expensive jewelry, watches or the like.
- Do not accept food and drinks from strangers; visitors have been known to be drugged and the robbed.

7. Weather

March to May marks the season of long rains in Kenya and therefore it is expected to be mostly cloudy or with showers during the day and often in Nairobi the sun may not be seen for days. The nights may experience heavy rains and thunder-storms. Nairobi's mean temperature falls to a maximum of 27 °C and a minimum of 14 °C.

8. Electricity

9. Official Language

The official languages of the Republic of Kenya are English and Kiswahili.

10. Currency

The official currency of the Republic of Kenya is the Kenya Shilling (Ksh). The current exchange rate vis-à-vis the US dollar is approximately KShs. 886.54 for one US dollar and KShs. 120.22 for one Euro (as of 17 March 2014).

11. Credit cards

Major credit cards are accepted in most hotels and restaurants in the city.
