North East Atlantic

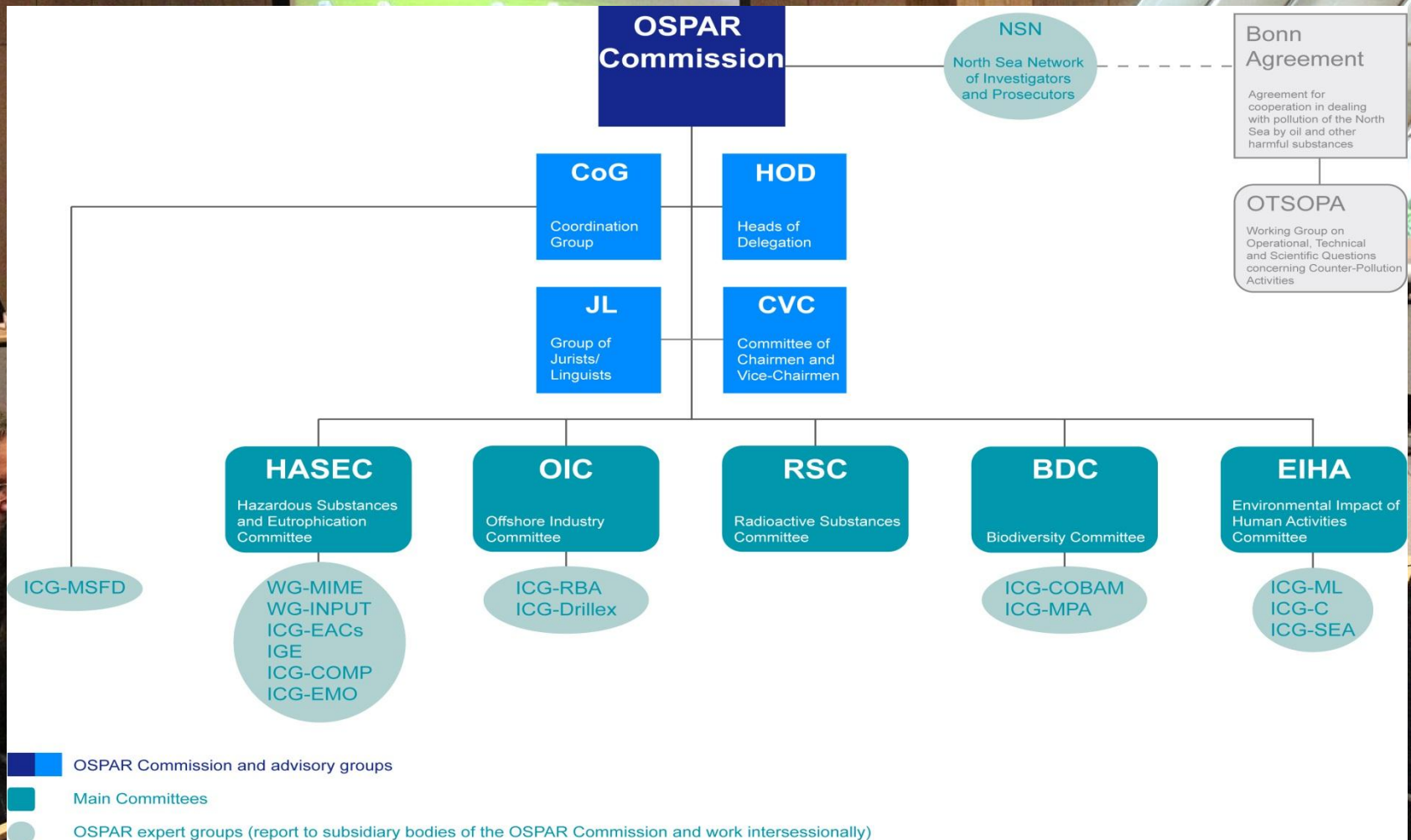
Main Objectives

- Best Available Techniques and Best Environmental Practices

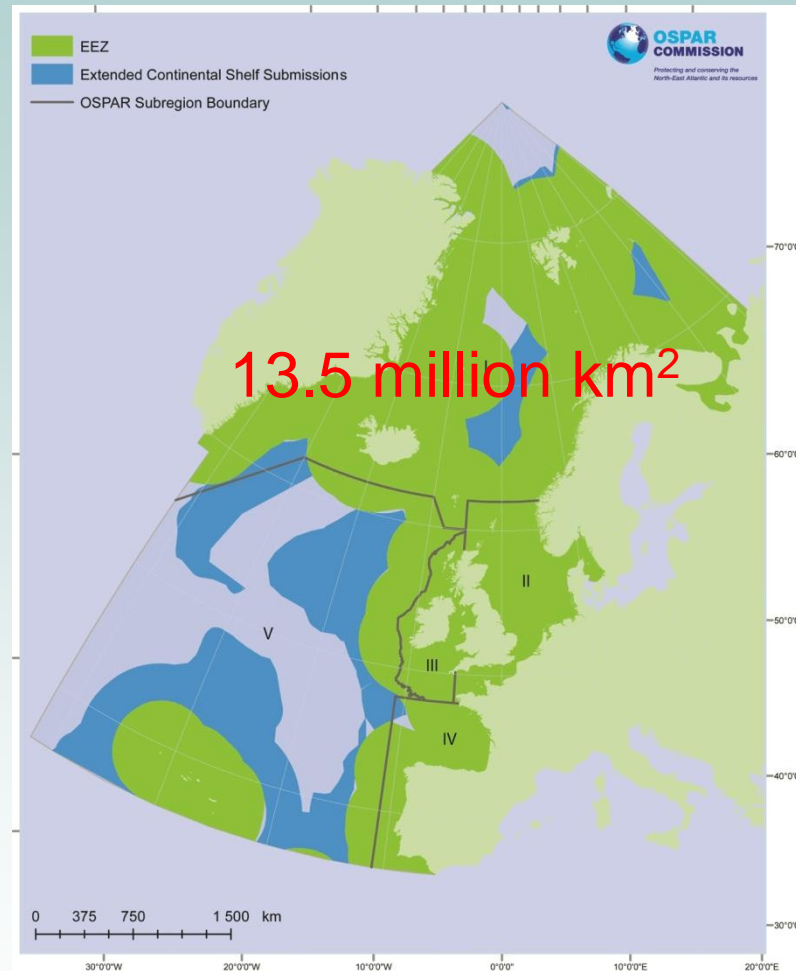

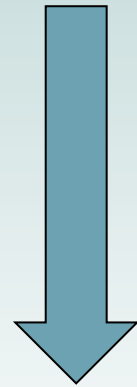

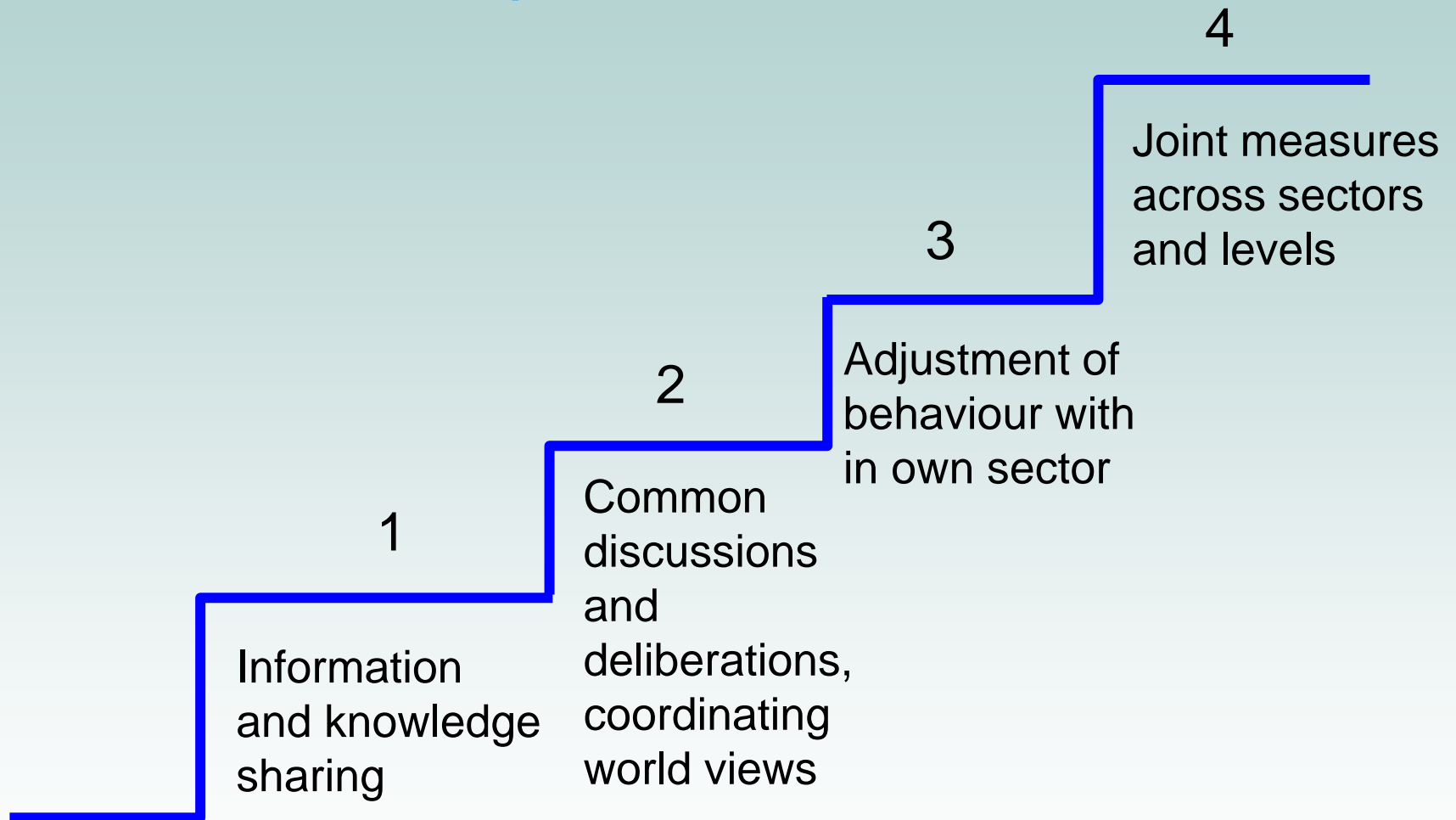

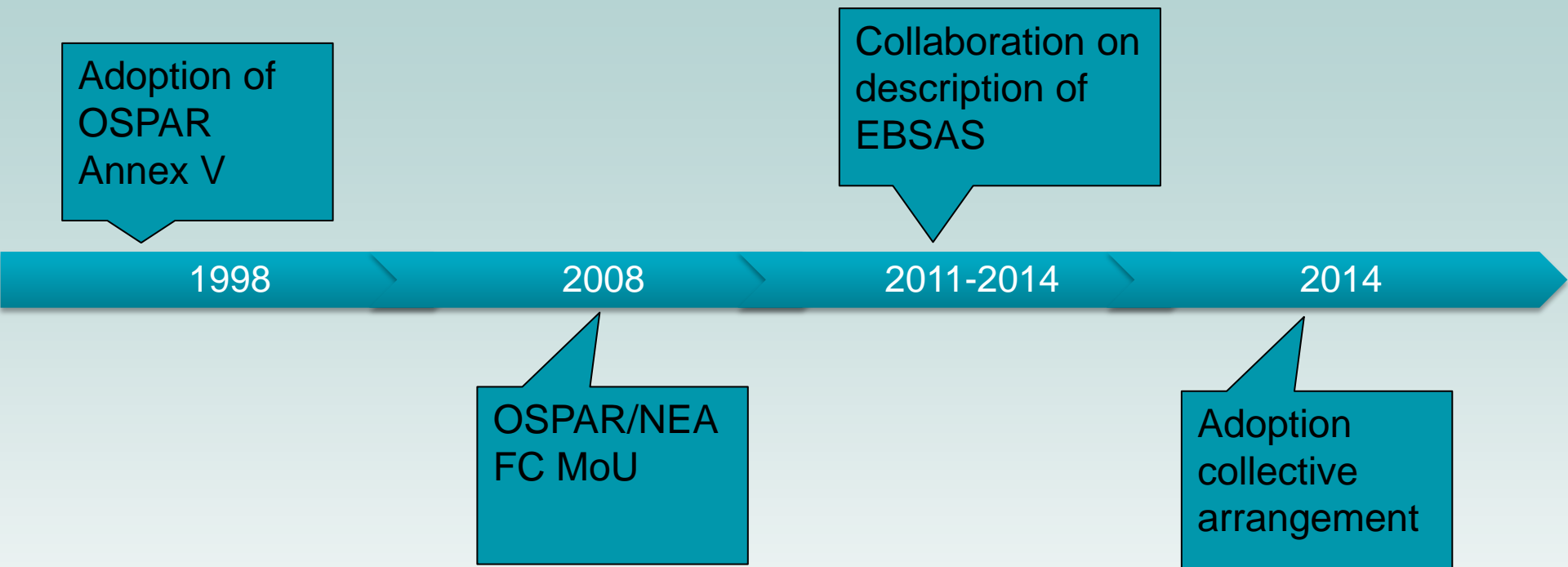

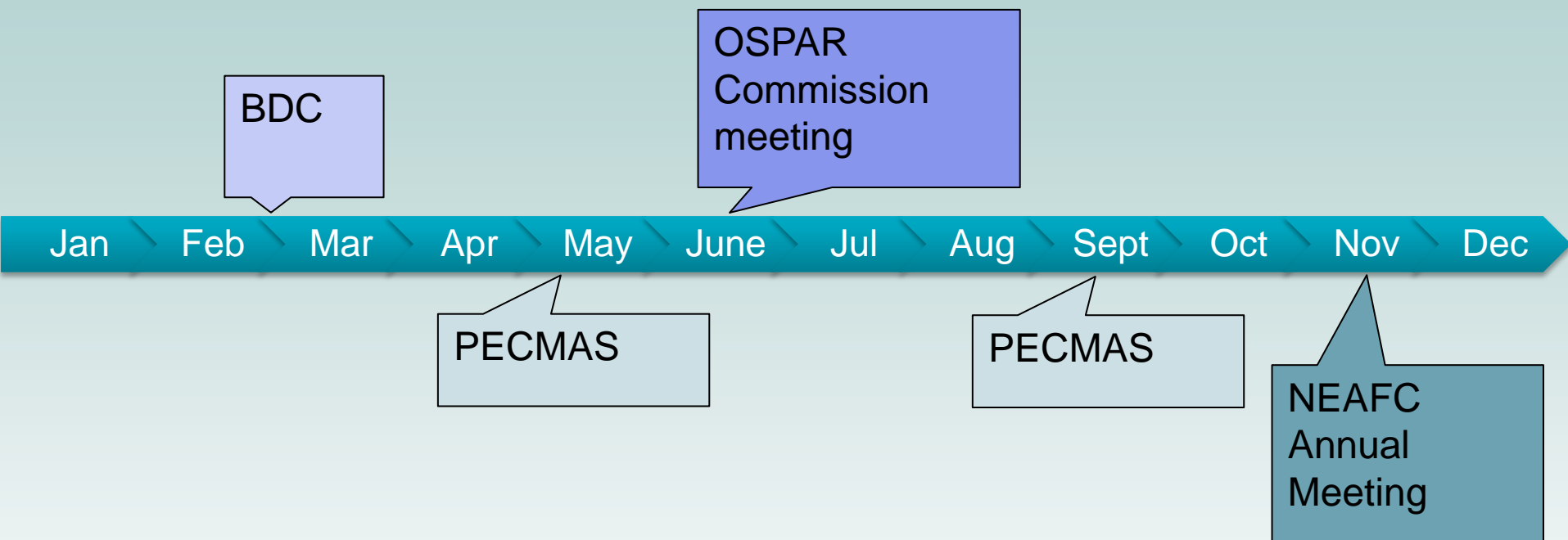
The ladder of cooperation: OSPAR and NEAFC
