I. <u>Global Updates:</u>

27th Session of UNEP Governing Council/Global Ministerial Environment Forum

The first universal session of the Governing Council/Global Ministerial Environment Forum will be held in Nairobi, Kenya, from 18-22 February 2013. The Governing Council/Global Ministerial Environment Forum (GC/GMEF) of the UN Environment Programme (UNEP) constitutes the ministerial-level global environmental forum in which participants gather to review important and emerging policy issues in the field of the environment. Among other matters, this first-ever universal session of the UNEP GC/GMEF is expected to discuss: the new Minamata Convention on Mercury and the Executive Director's report on financing options for chemicals and wastes; enhancing cooperation and coordination within the chemicals and wastes cluster; sustainable consumption and production; and justice, governance and law for environmental sustainability.

GUPES Green Room Event

The GUPES Green Room event is being organized by EETU and is scheduled for 20 February 2013, on the margins of the next session of the Governing Council / Global Ministerial Environment Forum (GC/GMEF) of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) which is scheduled for February 2013 at the United Nations Office in Nairobi, Kenya.

Mainstreaming Environment and Sustainability into Ethiopian Universities (MESE) Workshop

The MESA Reflection and Planning workshop was held from 19-20 Nov 2012 and it brought together over 30 participants from universities across Africa. It was also attended by participants drawn from Non-Governmental Organizations that have been working with universities in Africa. The MESE Planning Workshop was attended by over 50 participants from universities in Ethiopia, of which 4 were University Presidents, 3 were Deputy University Presidents, and others were Directors and Senior Managers of Environment and Sustainability institutes in their respective Universities. Achievements/outcomes, challenges and lessons learned from the first 2 phases of MESA were shared and some critical issues were flagged out for consideration in the MESA strategy for phase 3 (2013 – 2018).

Tongji Board Meeting report

On December 14, 2012, the 9th board meeting of UNEP-Tongji Institute of Environment for Sustainable Development (IESD) was held in Beijing. MESA National Seminar organized at the University of Zambia

Under EETU's networking pillar, the Zambia University will be organizing the first National MESA Seminar in Lusaka from 23 – 25 February 2013. This seeks to have active discussions with the new SAARC University on introducing sustainability courses in their new curriculum, as well as development of a pilot course on sustainability for Indian Administrative College. EETU will also further explore further collaboration for subsequent Leadership Programmes with Asian Development Bank and TERI University in India.

Sustainability Communities Course, in partnership with Aalto University (Finland), UNHABITAT and UONGOZI Institute in Tanzania

This will be held in Dar es salaam, Tanzania from 12 to 22 March 2013. Under EETU's Training Pillar, the partnership with Aalto University has been ongoing for several years. This training course is funded by the Finnish Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and targets for midcareer professionals primarily from East Africa. The workshop is intended for experienced individuals from academia, local or central government, business life and civil society with experience in urban and environmental planning. S/m will serve as resource person at the training workshop, while also introducing the GUPES initiatives to participants.

World Environmental Education Congress (WEEC), Marrakesh, Morocco

The WEEC will be held in partnership with the Environmental Education and Training Unit (EETU) of UNEP, in Marrakesh, Morocco from 9-14 June 2013. The conference theme is Environmental Education in Cities and Rural Areas: Seeking Greater Harmony. In addition, there will be 11 thematic niches, namely:

- 1. Promoting Environmental Education and Networking
- 2. Intercultural dialogues
- 3. Social Movements and building ecological societies
- 4. Communications and the impact of social media
- 5. Ecological economics and green economies
- 6. Ethics, eco-philosophy, human-nature relationships
- 7. Greening education.
- 8. Creative impulses i.e. Arts, imagination and emotional understanding
- 9. Pedagogy and learning
- 10. Research in environmental education
- 11. Risk, health, and environment

The Congress will also feature two UNEP side events, namely the MESA and GUPES, and a workshop on Environment, Disasters and Ecosystems co-organized by UNEP Post Conflict & Disasters Management Branch and the Partnership of Environment and Disaster Risk Reduction (PEDRR).
