Mid-Term Strategy (MTS)

- New direction for addressing environment at the global and regional levels
- Previous model - activity based
- New model - **Thematic** based, cross-disciplinary and integrated approaches across UNEP, the UN and other partners
- Sound knowledge, capacity building, partnership principles
- For the 2010 - 2013 work programs
- Results based, measurable impacts

MTS - Themes

- Climate change - marine, coastal - sea level rise and other physical changes, energy
- Disasters & Conflicts - preparedness
- EBM - integrated management frameworks, MPA networks
- Environmental governance
- Harmful substances
- Resource efficiency - resource use practices, subsidies MPAs

Themes

- Set of expected outcomes for each theme - UNEP's comparative advantage
- Delivery of the anticipated outcomes using a range of tools/approaches including sound knowledge, capacity building, communication, etc.
- Indicators of impact - a challenge
