The Statistics Division is pleased to release the final results of the 2011 Population and Housing Census, a major source of demographic and socio-economic statistics for Antigua and Barbuda. In fact, the census represents a rich source of data that can be used for simple and robust analyses on demographic, social, economic and spatial characteristics of the population.

Unlike the *Preliminary Report* released in January 2012, this publication contains statistical tables at the parish and national level derived from the topics included in the census household and person questionnaires. Some insight is provided on the census procedure, major concepts, methodology, quality control measures and other management aspects of the census operation. The entire operation of the census covered preparatory work, data collection, data processing and tabulation. The data processing continues and the analytical work is still under way.

- *2011 Population and Housing Census – Analytical Report:* This publication will provide more detailed and subject-oriented analyses including several charts and analytical tables.

An *Administrative Report* is also prepared and documents the entire census operation for

posterity and for use as a reference guide. It also serves to assess the reliability of the process such that the stability and consistency of the results can be confirmed.
