Overview of global outlook



Global economy remains trapped in prolonged episode of slow growth


In 2016, world gross product and world trade expanded at slowest pace since Great Recession

Modest recovery forecast for 2017/2018, but growth is not expected to approach pre-crisis average

Return to strong and balanced growth unlikely without concerted policy efforts to stimulate investment and productivity

Global economy trapped...





... in prolonged episode of slow growth

Prolonged slowdown...



Characterised by:

- Weak investment
- Dwindling world trade growth
- Flagging productivity growth
- High debt levels
- Conflict and geopolitical tensions
- Low commodity prices since mid-2014

. may remain self-propagating

Policy challenges

Raising finance for investment: Healthcare, education, social protection, climate change

A more balanced policy approach

- Mobilizing domestic/international public and private resources
- May need additional concessional international public financing for LDCs
- More effective use of fiscal policy
- Macro policy fully integrated with structural reforms targeting e.g. poverty, inequality, climate change

Greater international policy coordination

 Expedite clean technology transfer; raise climate finance; strengthen international tax cooperation; address challenge of large movements of refugees and migrants

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
