Background:

Expanding cross-border trade of agricultural products is an important vehicle for sustainable development for developing countries in the Asia-Pacific region. Overseas markets can provide more income for small-scale farmers than might receive by selling to the local markets. However, overseas markets require compliance with food safety, food quality and sustainability requirements. Furthermore, it often requires optimization of procedures in the agricultural supply chain as well as improving food safety and quality control systems.

This workshop is organized in collaboration with the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) and the Agricultural Marketing Association for Asia and the Pacific (AFMA).

Objective of the workshop:

- To build capacity of public and private sector stakeholders in the Asia-Pacific region on quality standards and control systems for fresh agricultural products;
- To raise awareness of particular food safety, food quality and sustainability standards and certifications for the export of fresh agricultural products to export markets;
- To review procedures and practices to enhance cross-border trade of agricultural products.

Target Countries: Bangladesh, Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar, Nepal, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Viet Nam, Thailand

Target participants: 25-30 officials and experts from ministries of agriculture and associations involved in facilitating the export of fresh agricultural exports and compliance to food safety, food quality and sustainability requirements.
