

Maldives does not face Major disasters often, however due to the lower resiliency within communities (possibly because of the living standards, cultural beliefs and lack of awareness) the high frequent, low impact natural phenomena's like, sea surges, flashfloods and etc.. are reported as incidents beyond communities coping capacity and the central government often had to intervene.



Tsunami – 2004

- 82 Died and 26 missing, 3,997 building damaged

Cyclone Nilam – 2012

28 Islands severely damaged (mainly infrastructural and agricultural damages)

Millions of MVR spent to provide fresh water
1/3 of Maldivian population

Severe Weather events (southern Region 2015

 Millions of MVR spent for reconstructions damaged houses in addu atoll

 4 families managed as IDP's and spend lacks of MVR for reconstruction and recovery

Severe weather events-2016 (southern)

 Millions of MVR spent for recovery of households of one island

Coastline (Shopping complex) fire 2016

 More than 170 managed as IDP's and spend millions of MVR for reconstruction and recovery

- Disaster Management act ratified by end of 2015
- Frame work for mainstreaming DRR into developmental plans validated and piloted in one island in 2015
- Local government authority integrated DRR
