

- Proposing ways to simplify and streamline documentation and formalities related to rail-based intermodal transport operations (at seaports, railway border crossings)
- Improving connections of electronic advance information systems for different modes of transport

Countries involved	China, Kazakhstan, Mongolia, Republic of Korea, Russian Federation
National partners (Government sector)	Government authorities in charge of land and maritime transport, port authorities, customs authorities
National partners (Private sector)	Railways, shipping lines, freight forwarders, professional associations

# Key activities

- Collect information and documentation on formalities related to: (i) rail-based intermodal transport with road and maritime segments, (ii) crossing borders, and (iii) use of electronic advance information systems by different modes of transport
- Conduct a study comprised of two components:

   simplification and streamlining of documents and formalities at seaports and border crossings
   improving connections of electronic advance information systems for different modes of transport

# Key activities

- Organize two expert group meetings to discuss:
  - (i) the simplified and streamlined documents and formalities at seaports and border crossings
  - (ii) the use of electronic advance information systems
- Organize one subregional meeting to review, discuss and adopt the recommendations of the study
- Organize five national workshops to promote the implementation of the recommendations of the study

Status of implementation as of August 2016

-Data collection missions to five countries undertaken;

-Draft study reports on (i) documentation and procedures and on (ii) development of information technologies prepared;

-Expert group meeting on information systems organized and held in Moscow on 1-2 June 2016 (in collaboration with CCTT);
