Need for an Integrated intermodal transport system

- Rising economic power of emerging economies leading to more demand for transport in the region
- Current development of transport indicates unsustainable trends
- Transport contributes 23 percent of global emissions and road contributes to 73 per cent
- Rio + 20 conference sustainable transport is central to sustainable development
- Transport at critical stage in its evolution- need of an integrated intermodal transport system and paperless transit can be enabler





Intermodal challenge

- Happens at the intermodal terminals/seaports, where there is change in transport mode
- Existence of different documents for each mode of transport (APEC 2011)
- Additional document requirements in countries
- Case of Bhutan and India transit
- Business process re-engineering is must





Interoperability challenge

- Levels of ICT development in various agencies in the same country and among countries
- Efforts to integrate them at national, subregional and regional level can be substantial, given the diversity of hardware and software
- Non-existing or inadequate infrastructure at the land border crossing (electricity and internet availability)
- National/subregional/regional standards vs international standards





Mutual recognition challenge

- Diverse requirements under AEO programmes in different countries can create difficulties in mutual acceptance
- Mutual recognition of AEO programmes (100 agreements for 10 countries)
- Have a regional AEO programme under the regional transit system





Guarantee Management challenge

- Weak information systems poses guarantee management challengetransit involves sharing information at three places
- Lack of financial interoperability meaning that banks can issue bonds that other country's customs can call
- Competition among guarantors is healthy but needs oversight





Coordination challenge

- Transit involves numerous government agencies (customs, immigration, transport, police
- Private sector (importer/exporter, customs broker, transport operators, freight forwarders, guarantee association)
