



UNNExT workshop on Trade Facilitation: Paperless Trade Facilitation for Small and Medium-sized Enterprises

4-6 May 2015 Grand Hotel Tien Shan Almaty, Kazakhstan

Background

The purpose of the workshop is to build the capacity of Governments and other stakeholders to better understand, identify and address trade facilitation and paperless trade measures that have a proportionally larger impact for Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (SMEs). The focus is on ensuring that national governments in targeted countries have the tools and understanding of how to best integrate SMEs specific policies and measures into their trade facilitation reform plans and paperless trade system designs.

This workshop is organized by the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP), in cooperation with several other organizations, including the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe, the International Finance Corporation/World Bank Group and the Islamic Development Bank.

This workshop is part of a larger United Nations Network for Paperless Trade in Asia and the Pacific (UNNExT) related project aiming to build national governments' capacity to implement paperless systems for cross-border trade and transport facilitation and support the implementation of national and regional single windows in developing countries of the region. Given the importance of Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) in the Asia region, SMEs and Trade Facilitation is one of the key areas of focus of UNNExT for 2014/2015. Objectives:

- 1. Increase awareness and understanding of trade facilitation and paperless trade measures to support SMEs' participation in international trade and global value chains.
- 2. Share experience and case studies on programmes and ICT applications that facilitate SMEs' participation in international trade and global value chains.
- 3. Discuss and collect inputs for the consolidation of a draft Guide on paperless trade facilitation for SMEs.

Target countries: Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, Turkmenistan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan.

Target participants: 30 officers and experts from relevant Ministries and research/training institutions working on trade facilitation and SME, in particular with a focus on Information and Communications Technology (ICT) applications. Stakeholders would be drawn from Ministries of Commerce, Ministries of Industry, Customs, SME/Export promotion authorities and research institutes.

Language: the workshop will be conducted in English with simultaneous translation to Russian available. Documents will be in English and/or Russian.
