



UNNExT workshop on Trade Facilitation and Paperless Systems for Agrifood Products

4-6 May 2015 Grand Hotel Tien Shan Almaty, Kazakhstan

Background

The purpose of the workshop is to build the capacity of regulatory agencies and other stakeholders involved in agricultural and food products trade to participate in and implement paperless systems to facilitate trade and enhance the international marketability of agrifood products. The workshop is targeted at relevant officials in charge of agrifood trade facilitation andto trainers from relevant training institutes and agricultural extension services in Central Asia.

This workshop is organized by the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP), in cooperation with several other organizations, including the United Nations Economic Commission for Europeand the Islamic Development Bank.

The workshop is part of a larger United Nations Network for Paperless Trade in Asia and the Pacific (UNNExT) related project aiming to build national governments' capacity to implement paperless systems for cross-border trade and transport facilitation and support the implementation of national and regional single windows in developing countries of the region. Objectives:

- To introduce the participants to the relevant issues, systems and standards associated with the trade of agricultural goods and the implementation of relevant paperless systems.
- To increase awareness and provide an in depth look of business process analysis for the trade of agrifood products in Central Asia.
- To identify bottlenecks to trade in agricultural goods in the Central Asia region and provide some recommendations of trade facilitation measures to address these issues.

Target countries: Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan

Target participants: 30-35 officers and experts from relevant Ministries and research institutions working in the area of trade facilitation. Stakeholders would be drawn from Ministries of Agriculture, Ministry of Commerce, Customs, Sanitary and Phytosanitary authorities and research institutes.

Language: The workshop will be conducted in English with simultaneous translation to Russian available. Documents will be in English and/or Russian.
