
Dispute settlement Cornerstone of the WTO system

- Accessible only to governments, not individuals or corporations
- WTO dispute bodies have:
 - exclusive jurisdiction over WTO obligations
 - no jurisdiction over non-WTO obligations?
- Fully-binding in international law
- Strong judicial elements
 - right to a hearing, detailed procedures, automaticity, deadlines, appeals

WTO dispute settlement Total number of procedures since 1995


Consultations	481


