

The website is available in English, as well as the 5 subregional languages (Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Mongolian and Russian).




Population Ageing in East and North-East Asia (ENEA)

• To create *an online community* of individuals and organizations promoting age-friendly societies in East and North-East Asia


