

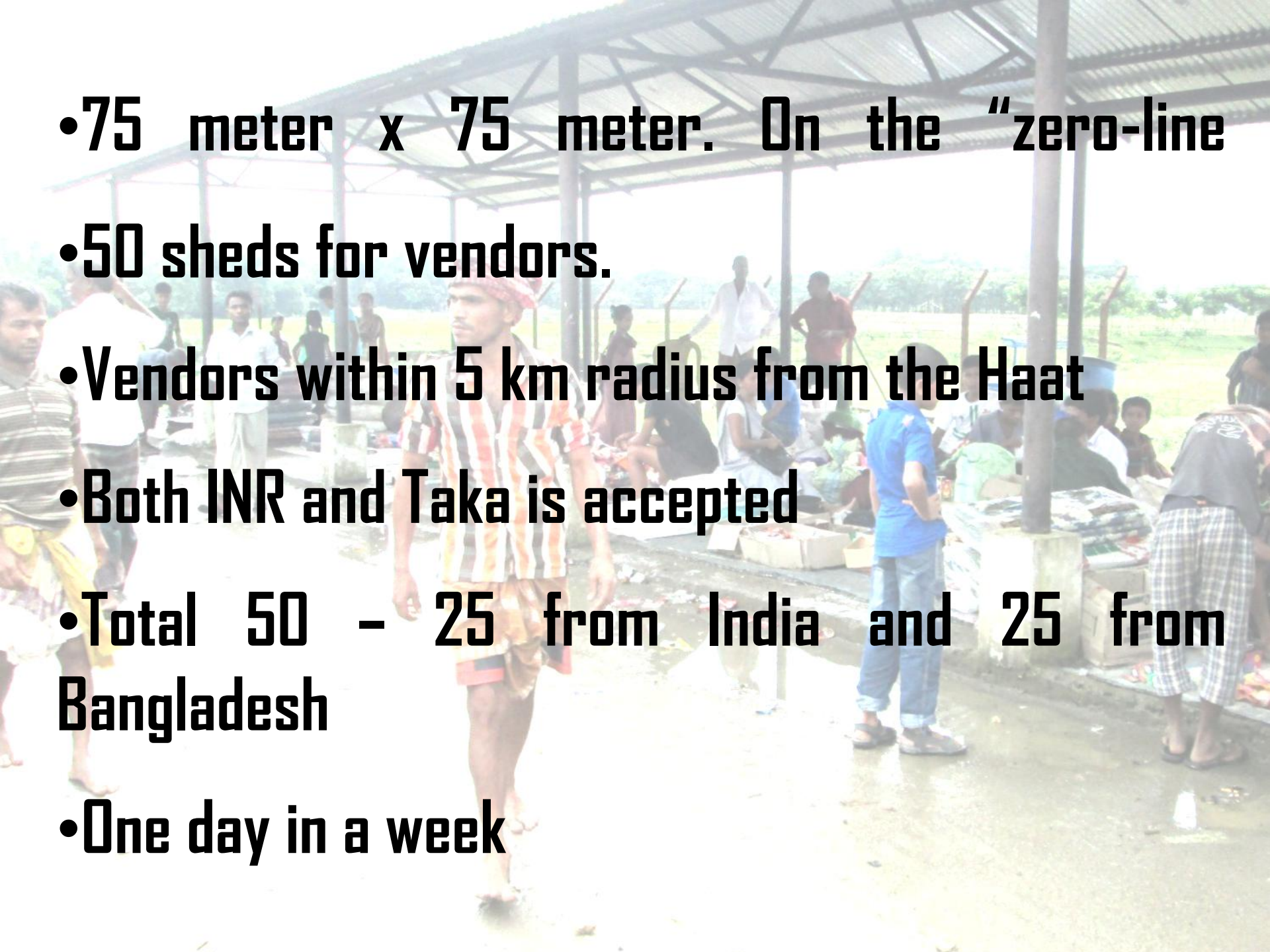


Border Haats: Local Economic Impact

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**Where: East Khasi Hills District Meghalaya,
India and Sunamgunj District, Bangladesh**



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- 75 meter x 75 meter. On the "zero-line"
 - 50 sheds for vendors.
 - Vendors within 5 km radius from the Haat
 - Both INR and Taka is accepted
 - Total 50 - 25 from India and 25 from Bangladesh
 - One day in a week

Border Haat Management Committee:

- **Border Security Force**
- **Police**
- **Customs**
- **Village/Union Level Local Government**
- **Additional District Magistrate/SDM**
- **Both India and Bangladesh have this Committee**





**Total Transactions amounts to anything
between INR 0.3-0.4 million for one day**

Traded Items

Meghalaya

- Vegetables,
- Fruits
- Beetlenut
- Bay leaves
- Spices



Bangladesh: cottage industry items

- *gamchha, lungi*, garments, mats
- plastic and melamine products
- processed food items, juices, agricultural produce
- household tools like spade, axe, plough, *dao*, etc

Benefits

- **Lower price for locals due to lower transaction and transportation costs**
- **Higher availability of everyday requirements**
- **Income for local vendors**
- **Small time trading opportunities for villages around the area**
