The European Port Community Systems Association

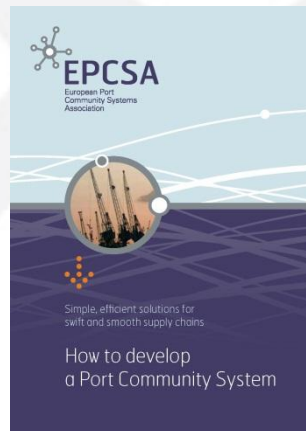
- Formed in 2011, currently 19 members more in process of joining from across the world

- optimises, manages and automates port and logistics efficient processes through a single submission of data and connecting transport and logistics chains.

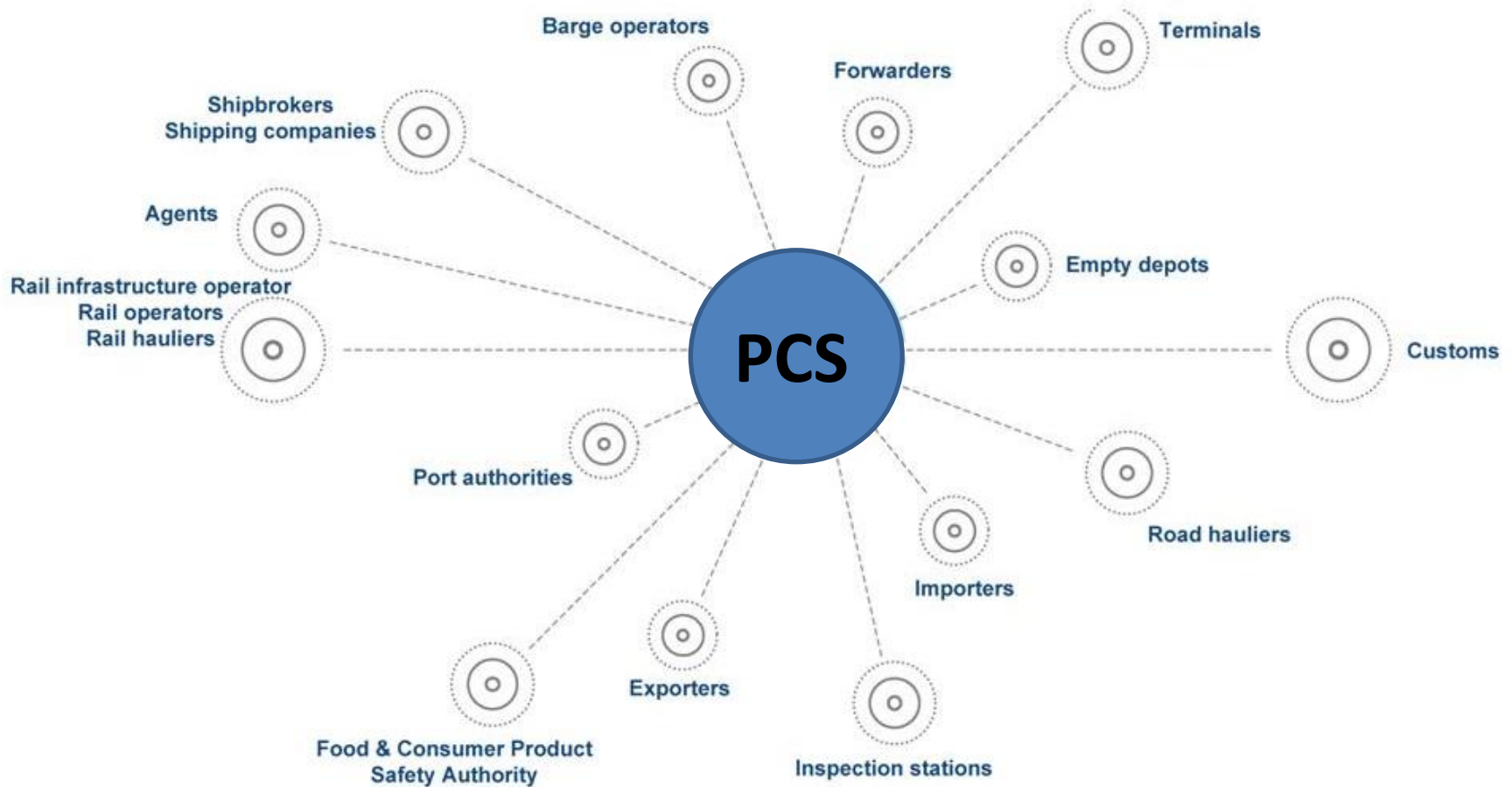
Why Port Community Systems ?

Link Administrative and Operational trade procedures electronically via intelligent exchange of messages on a end to end basis, machine to machine, with all stakeholders These may include:

- Customs
- Government Agencies
- Trade



The Port Community System



Trade Facilitation

- Trade facilitation can be defined as the simplification and harmonisation of international trade procedures including import and export procedures.
- Trade Facilitation is about Trade Logistics
- Trade Facilitation should mean Logistics Performance - LPI: customs, infrastructure, International shipments, logistics competence, tracking and tracing, timeliness

European eManifest proposal

1. Provide a customs status indicator for goods appearing on the manifest.
2. Fulfill core requirements of the Reporting Formalities Directive.
 - *Fulfill arrival manifest and cargo declaration reporting requirements (FAL forms 1 and 2). Suppressing remaining use of those forms.*
 - *Goods status indicator to enable swift and non bureaucratic release of union goods. Extend to EU goods under export procedure.*
 - *e-manifest to be marked with a 'C' for Union goods, an 'N' for non-Union goods, an 'X' for export procedure goods.*
