Development Account (DA)

- •The Development Account framework was established by the General Assembly in 1997
- A mechanism to fund capacity development projects of the economic and social entities of the UN
- Projects financed from the DA aim at achieving
 development impact through building the socio-economic
 capacity of developing countries through collaboration at
 the national, sub-regional, regional and inter-regional levels





Development Account (DA)

- DA projects are implemented by 10 global and regional UN entities: DESA, the five Regional Commissions, UNCTAD, UNEP, UN-Habitat and UNODC
- Projects are programmed in tranches, which represent the DA's programming cycle. Programming in each tranche is guided by a theme that reflects the current aims of the General Assembly and the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC).
- Since 1997 there have been more than 256 projects with a total budget of \$152.9 million


7th Tranche theme is "Support to addressing key global development challenges to further the achievement of internationally agreed development goals, through collaboration at the global, regional and national levels" Overall goal:

- To ensure that developing countries, countries with economies in transition, and the least developed countries benefit from trade
- Project objectives:
- Ensuring that the Aid for Trade initiative is inclusive;
- Sharing knowledge and information on how the different regions are implementing and monitoring Aid for Trade;
- Developing global consensus on the identification of indicators that can be used to monitor Aid for Trade




