

SOLOMON ISLANDS





CONSTRAINTS...

- Long distances
- Small populations and low demand in remote areas
- Difficult sea and anchorage conditions
- Limited pool of operators in private sector
- Institutional capacity constraints in former Marine Division

... CONSEQUENCES

- Shipping to remote rural areas is not profitable
- Rural populations have reduced economic opportunities
- Central government services providing health and education have limited access to rural populations
- Ad-hoc charters to rural destinations are expensive
- Maritime transport is unsafe



THE DOMESTIC MARITIME SUPPORT PROJECT

- US\$24.6 million project (about SBD\$175 million)
- Financed by Government of Solomon Islands with assistance from ADB, Government of Australia, European Union and Government of New Zealand
- Implemented by Ministry of Infrastructure Development

Objective:

 Reduce economic disadvantage in Solomon Island rural areas by providing safe, frequent, and reliable shipping services to remote destinations.

3 Outputs:

- 1. Reconstruct 10 new wharves and jetties in remote areas
- 2. Establish a Franchise Shipping Scheme that subsidizes private sector operators
- Establish the Solomon Islands Maritime Safety Administration by reforming MID Marine Division



RECONSTRUCTION OF WHARVES AND JETTIES

- Wharves designed with 50 year service life.
- Resilient to natural disasters, especially earthquakes and tsunamis
- Minimum EIRR 8% engaging with weakly performing countries
- 11 wharves and jetties selected:
- 1. Niumara Wharf, Central Province (complete)
- 2. Nu'usi Wharf, Central Province (complete)
- 3. Mbunikalo Wharf, Western Province (complete)
- 4. Katurasele Wharf, Choiseul Province (complete)
- 5. Manikaraku Wharf, Guadalcanal Province (complete)
- 6. Ringgi Wharf, Western Province
- 7. Keru Wharf, Western Province
- 8. Ngasini Wharf, Western Province
- 9. Tatamba Wharf, Isabel Province
- 10. Uhu Landing Ramp, Malaita Province
