- Vessel calls (number, frequency, reliability, fares and freight rates).
- Numbers of passengers, cargo tonnages, commodities handled and TEUs loaded and unloaded.
- Fleet size, age and type.
- Shipping service network.
- Government support and other interventions (franchises, route licensing, subsidies,
- Commissions and other interventions).
- Challenges and opportunities in the provision of shipping services

In addition, countries are invited to deliver a presentation of not more than 10 minutes covering the challenges faced by their country in strengthening interisland shipping in the sub-region and solutions to overcome those challenges.
