THE AID FOR TRADE INITIATIVE



"Aid for Trade should aim to help developing countries, particularly LDCs, to build the supply-side capacity and traderelated infrastructure that they need to assist them to implement and benefit from WTO Agreements and more broadly to expand their trade"

(Hong Kong Ministerial Declaration para.57)

Why the initiative was launched

- To bring new political focus to on-going efforts to help DC's, particularly LDCs, integrate into the multilateral trading system
- To help these countries overcome structural constraints which hamper their ability to engage in trade
- To help build supply side capacities in these countries so that they can benefit from the market access opportunities that the Doha Round may create for them
- While Aid for Trade is not part of the DDA, it is an important complement to the Round.

Why the initiative was launched

- To monitor global aid for trade flows and to ensure that these are additional funds, and not funds diverted from other developmental projects/areas
- Increase donor coordination and ensure that aid becomes even more demand driven
- To increase ownership in the beneficiary countries and get them to prioritise and express their needs
- To put a spotlight on what the international organisations and the donors are doing in terms of best practices, and then ensure that these are replicated.

AFT - What it is

- Aid for Trade is part of the existing official development assistance (ODA)
- The objective is to help developing countries, in particular LDCs, to build capacity to benefit from trade liberalization
- Assistance to address internal barriers, including supply side constraints
- In addition aims to promote monitoring, aid effectiveness and accountability

AFT - What it is not

- It is not a new global development fund; nor is it a substitute for multilateral trade liberalization or a quid-pro for concluding the DDA
- It is not meant to lead to any reduction of ODA to nontrade areas
- It is not intended to multilateralize what is essentially a bilateral process
- It is also not intended to replace the EIF for the LDCs, which will continue to the concrete implementation arm of AFT

What is WTO's Role

- Encouraging donors to make **more and better Aid for Trade** available to development partners
- Promoting mainstreaming of trade into national and regional economic planning frameworks;
- Promoting the **regional dimension** of Aid for Trade;
- Highlighting effective **implementation** of Aid-for-Trade strategies and programmes,.
