### GSPA on public health, innovation and intellectual property (WHA61.21)

- GSPA (2008)-IGWG pursuant to the independent Commission on Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), Innovation and Public Health (CIPIH) under WHA56.27 in 2003.
- The CIPIH report (2006)-status of innovation, IPR and the pharmaceutical industry
- 108 specific actions across 25 sub elements and eight main elements. These main elements are:
  - 1. prioritizing research and development needs;
  - 2. promoting research and development;
  - 3. building and improving innovative capacity;
  - 4. transfer of technology;
  - 5. application and management of intellectual property to contribute to innovation and promote public health;
  - 6. improving delivery and access;
  - 7. promoting sustainable financing mechanisms; and
  - 8. establishing and monitoring reporting systems.



#### CEWG on Research and Development: financing and coordination for public health, innovation and intellectual property

- Consultative Expert Working Group (CEWG) on Research and Development: financing and coordination
- The proposals found to be accomplishing the relevant criteria are:
  - A globally binding R&D instrument
  - Direct grants to companies in developing countries
  - Equitable licensing
  - Patent pools,
  - Pooled funds,
  - Precompetitive R&D platforms/Open source and access and
  - Prizes



#### South East-Asia Regional Response

- Regional Resolutions SEA/RC62/R6, 2009 and SEA/RC63/R6, 2010 - capacity building to implement trade and intellectual property policies for access to safe, efficacious, quality and affordable medical products
- A Regional Consultation for "Regional Framework on Public Health, Innovation and Intellectual Property" was held in WHO-SEARO, New Delhi, on 5-6 April 2011 that has identified national and regional priorities for all eight elements and 25 sub-elements of GSPA on a set of templates.
- Regional Meeting was held on Consultative Expert Working Group (CEWG) progress for Member States representatives in SEARO on 7 October 2011.
