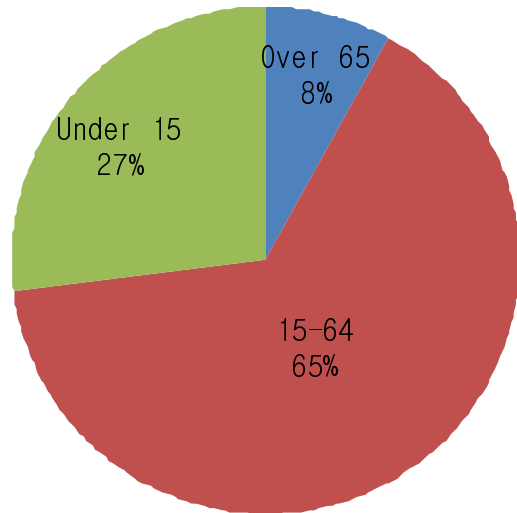

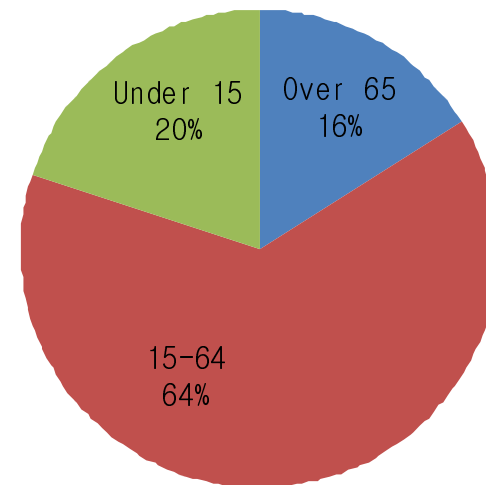
- World Population in 2011

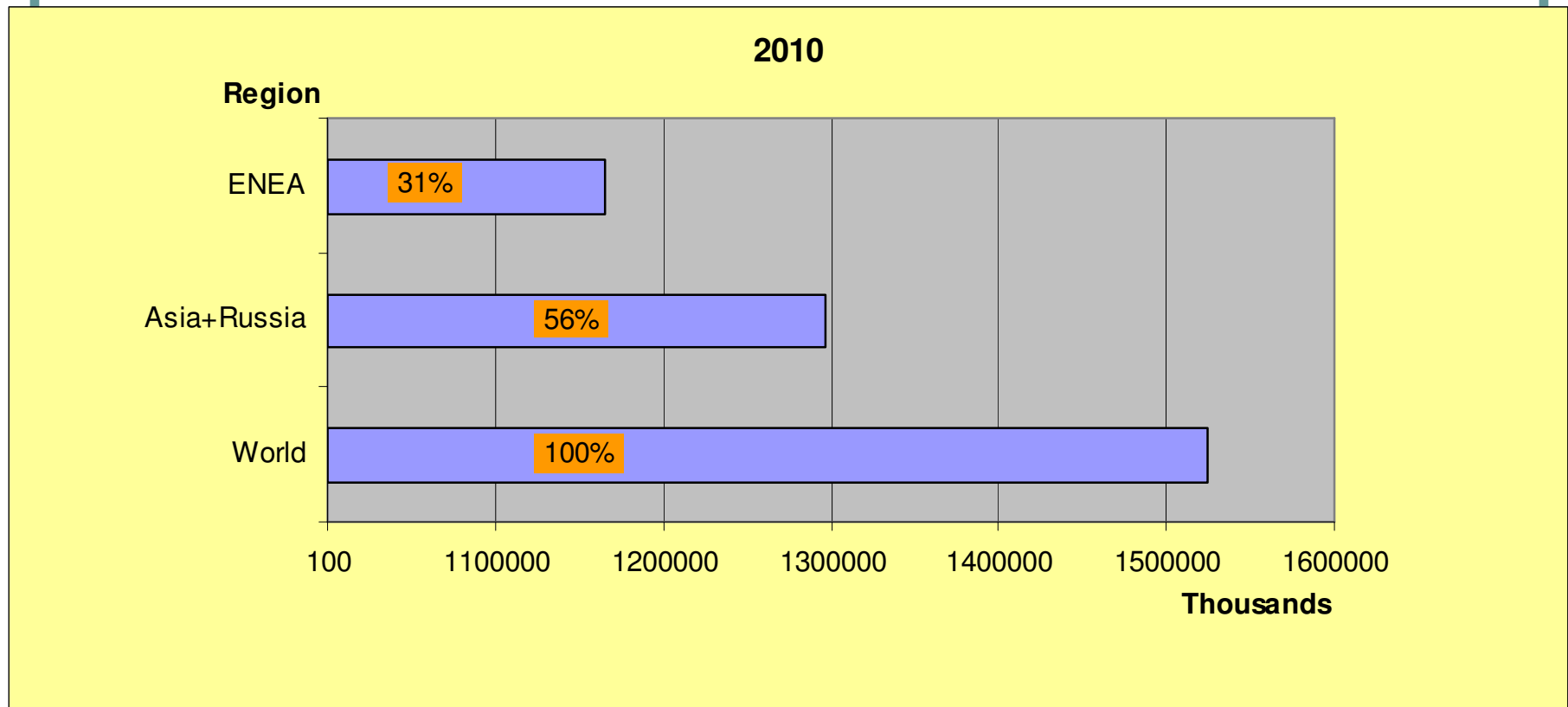

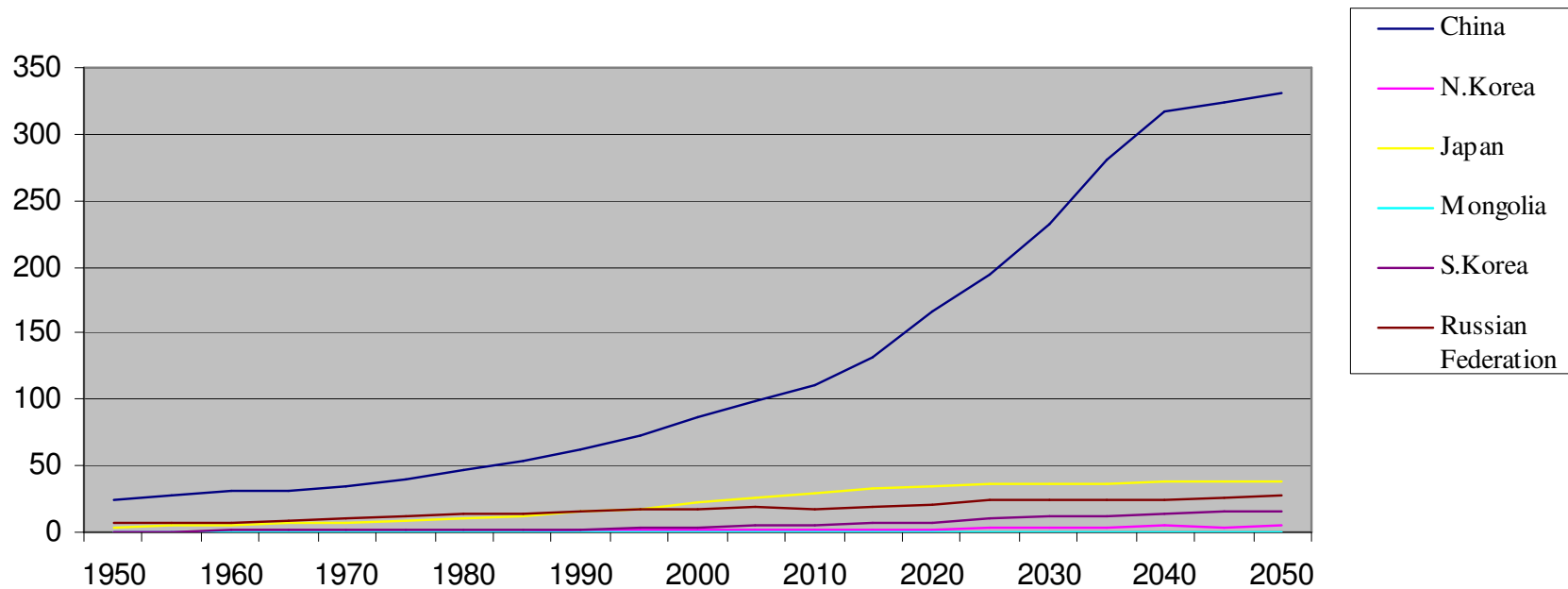
Ageing in ENEA seen in Asia and the world

- 2010: Persons over 65 years



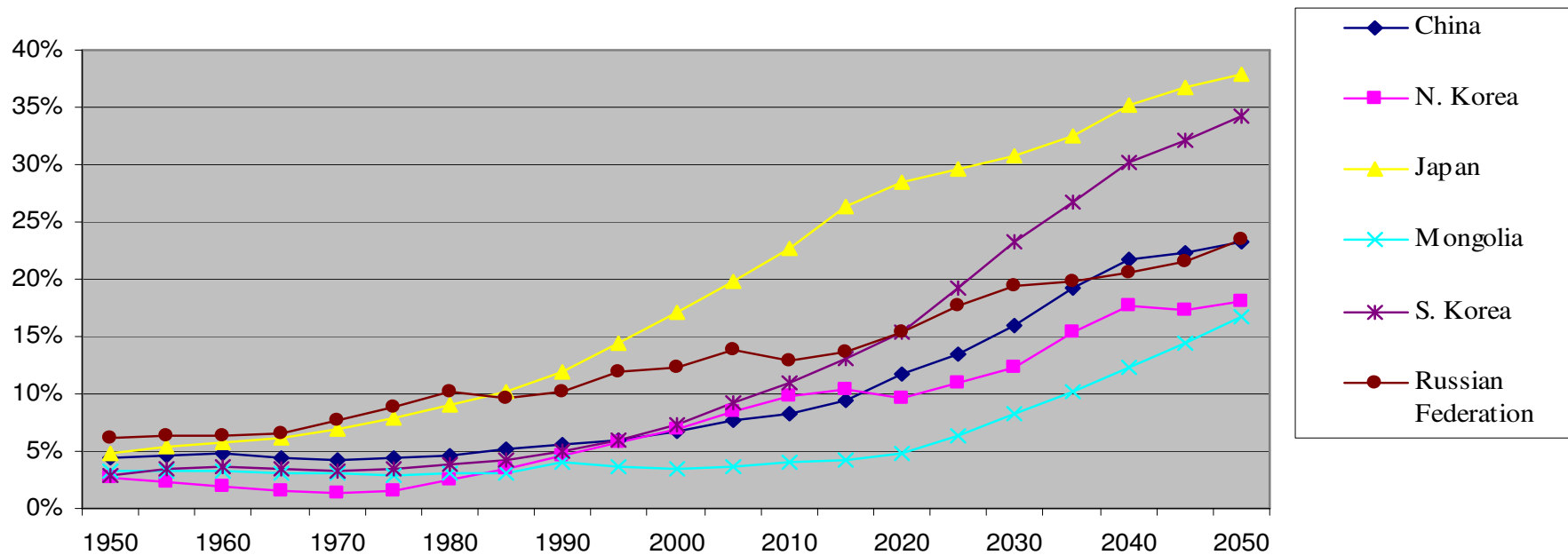
Increasing number of older persons in ENEA countries

- **Mongolia**
 - Rapidly ageing
 - Need to mainstream ageing into socio-economic development policies
- **Russian Federation**
 - Population below replacement level
 - Older women outnumber older men
