

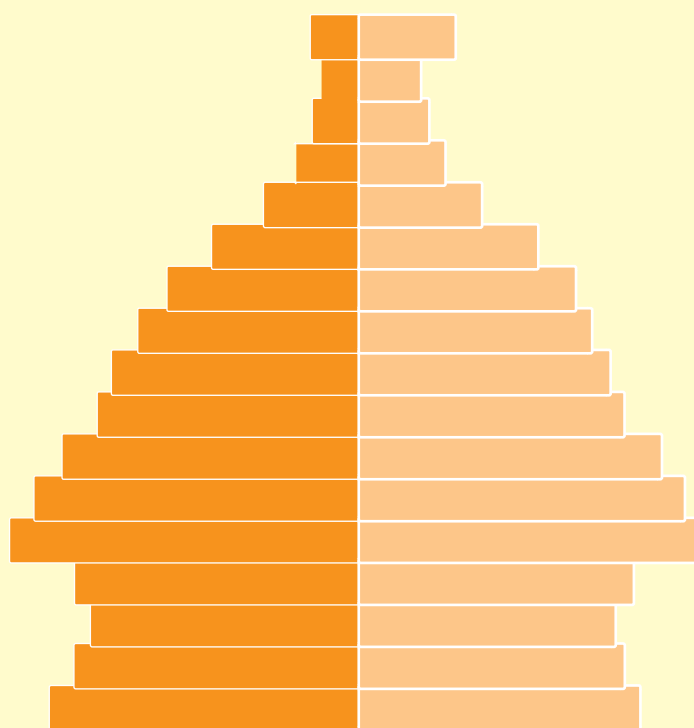

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INTRODUCTION

In 2014, the General Statistics Office successfully conducted the 1/4/2014 Intercensal Population and Housing Survey, a large-scale, national sample survey. The 2014 survey has provided reliable data on population size national, regional, provincial and district level 5 years after the 2009 Population and Housing Census, as well as information on housing and other demographic characteristics for 63 provinces and cities throughout the country. The survey results are an important basis for assessing national population and housing programs, implementation of the socio-economic development plan in the 2011–2015 period, and for policy making and planning related to population and housing – to support socio-economic development planning in the 2016-2020 period. The results are also useful for supervising implementation of the United Nations Millennium Development Goals as pledged by the Government of Viet Nam and United Nations.

To improve the effectiveness of application of the 1/4/2014 Intercensal Population and Housing Survey's dataset, the General Statistics Office has researched and released the results of Viet Nam's population projections for the 2014-2049 period. The results provide data on population and development trends projected, providing a basis for making policies on development investments in the future. The results also ensure that the needs for data among leaders, managers, researchers and users at all levels and branches are met.

This report presents the methodology, principles, and assumptions used to prepare the population projections for the period 2014-2049, including the projected population for the whole country, for the urban and rural populations, and for populations of 63 provinces and cities.
