


Guyana

November - December 2021

Guyana hosts an estimated 24,500 Venezuelan refugees and migrants as of December 2021 as well as a small number of refugees of other nationalities. Between November and December, UNHCR observed the **arrival** of an **average of 50 individuals** per month at the monitored border entry points in Regions 1 and 2, including Venezuelan Waraos. Venezuelans are issued with a **Government stay permit** upon arrival, which is valid for three months and requires periodic renewal.

CONTEXT

The COVID-19 pandemic continues to burden the healthcare system and seriously hinder access to livelihoods and employment for refugees, asylumseekers, and local communities. Between Novermber and December, UNHCR delivered aid, including food kits and sanitary items, and provided interpretation support to facilitate access to Government services.


Gender-Based Violence (GBV) remains a major concern, particularly for Venezuelan refugees and migrants – mainly women – who have been victims of trafficking and/or engage in survival sex.

UNHCR continues to support the Government of Guyana in the delivery of assistance and protection to vulnerable refugees and asylum-seekers (including women, children and survivors of GBV) and to local communities, while working in coordination with partners under the R4V Inter Agency Response Platform.

UNHCR delivers assistance to displaced Venezuelans in Region 1



In November, UNHCR assisted more than 150 people in Mabaruma (Region 1) with food bags and core relief items such as jerry cans for water storage and plastic sheeting. Moreover, government health officials administered COVID-19 vaccines, and immigration officials facilitated the extension and issuance of stay permits.



UNHCR Response and Strategy

UNHCR works with four partners in Guyana and supports the State in the delivery of assistance and protection to vulnerable refugees and asylum-seekers. UNHCR also works in coordination with other partners under the R4V Platform to provide responses on education, food security, health, integration, protection, shelter, WASH, and cash assistance, among others. Main Activities

Alongside the government, partner organizations, civil society, development actors, and UN Agencies, UNHCR undertakes protection and solutions activities, including:

Gender-based Violence

UNHCR through HIAS continued actions for gender-based violence (GBV) response and prevention throughout the year. Community mobilizers reached 104 persons with GBV prevention messaging in remote mining communities; case management services were provided to 8 GBV survivors; 15 men were trained as agents of change; and 104 persons received counselling on rights, services, and referral pathways. Additionally, UNHCR through Blossom Inc. supported 21 GBV survivors with trauma focused therapy.

Child Protection

UNHCR through Blossom Inc. delivered child protection trainings to 65 community leaders, health and education professionals, police, Blossom's Child Advocacy Centre (CAC) workers, as well as other government officials and partners. Moreover, Blossom Inc. conducted 16 forensic interviews with Guyanese children who survived sexual abuse and provided case management services to 5 Venezuelan children. Additionally, 172 Venezuelan children in four indigenous communities in Region 1 enrolled in community-based face-to-face ESL classes and received education support, including notebooks and workbooks, pencils, backpacks, among others.

Water, Hygiene and Sanitation (WASH)

▲ UNHCR donated 1,108 bars of soap, and 506 jerry cans for storing water to 9 vulnerable communities in Region 1, benefiting approximately 866 people. UNHCR also donated WASH supplies and hand sanitizers to ensure the safe operation of the ESL community classes. Additionally, UNHCR delivered hygiene kits to approximately 254 people.

Cash-based Interventions and In-kind Assistance

UNHCR distributed multipurpose cash and material support to approximately 1,145 people. Additionally, UNHCR distributed 394 food baskets, 312 solar lamps, and 25 plastic sheeting to communities in Regions 1, 2, and 4.

╆ Health

UNHCR donated 300 mosquito nets to the Office of the Regional Health Officer in Mabaruma, Region 1, to support the response of local authorities to vector-transmitted diseases, and another 885 mosquito nets to communities in Regions 1, 2, and 4. Moreover, UNHCR joined the National Aids Programme Secretariat (NAPS) in an outreach in regions 1 and 8 for the occasion of the World Aids Day, where 146 people were tested for HIV, Syphillis or Hepatitis B, and received related counselling.

Education

UNHCR supported access to education for 137 students, including adults and children, in virtual ESL classes; three mobile devices and one data bundle were delivered to support connectivity and participation in these classes. Moreover, 230 out-of-school children in four communities in Region 1 participated in Emergency Community Classes. Each of the children was provided with PPE items and learning materials and resources. To increase enrolment in the public school system, 10,000 leaftets on access to education in Guyana, produced in collaboration with the Ministry of Education, were printed for distribution.
