OVERVIEW | GLOBAL INITIATIVES REFUGEE RESPONSE PLANS

Refugee Response Plans in 2022

In 2022, UNHCR will continue to lead and coordinate Refugee Response Plans (RRPs) with partners to respond to complex refugee crises, including those involving mixed refugee and migrant movements, this will include the UNHCR-led regional RRPs for the Afghanistan, Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and South Sudan situations. In addition, UNHCR and UNDP will continue to co-lead the Regional Refugee and Resilience Plan in response to the Syria crisis (3RP). And with IOM, UNHCR will continue co-leading the regional Refugee and Migrant Response Plan (RMRP) for refugees and migrants from Venezuela and the Joint Response Plan (JRP) for the Rohingya humanitarian crisis in Bangladesh.

RRPs cover inter-agency responses in 39 refugee-hosting countries and, where appropriate, are an integrated yet distinct part of inter-agency humanitarian response plans. To support host-government efforts to address the needs of refugees, as well as host communities and other persons of concern impacted by crises, the RRPs' focus will remain on ensuring protection and promoting solutions through multisectoral response activities supporting the objectives stated in the 2016 New York Declaration for Refugees and Migrants and ensuring appropriate linkages with the Global Compact on Refugees (GCR) and the Global Compact on Migration (GCM).

Many interventions are humanitarian in nature; however, emphasis will be placed on delivering comprehensive responses that combine humanitarian and development activities that bridge the humanitarian-development-peace nexus by also responding to the longer-term resilience and integration needs of affected populations and host communities. In this connection, in 2022 stronger linkages with development partners, financial institutions, the

private sector, and, where relevant, peace actors will be pursued to ensure progress towards the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and realizing the pledge of Leaving No One Behind.

In addition, the 2022 RRPs will continue to integrate new health and socioeconomic needs caused by the COVID-19 pandemic in the responses, namely for situations where underlying vulnerabilities were already exacerbated by conflict and violence. Programming is made through an integrated age, gender and diversity (AGD) mainstreaming approach, ensuring particular focus on people with disabilities or other specific needs.

Several cross-cutting priorities are included in the 2022 RRPs. Understanding the different dynamics of climate change on displacement, partners will upscale environmental mainstreaming, where possible and appropriate, and they will strive to ensure protection of displaced people who are exposed to natural disasters and to promote environmental sustainability. Measures to prevent, mitigate the risks of and respond to sexual exploitation and abuse as well as sexual harassment (SEA/SH) will be prioritized and integrated in all sector programmes within the 2022 RRPs. Activities to strengthen the empowerment of communities and accountability towards affected populations (AAP) are core elements of the plans.

A strong focus on localization, in particular through refugee- and women-led as well as faith-based organizations will be key to the successful implementation of these plans.
