# WFP NEPAL 2021 ANNUAL COUNTRY REPORT OVERVIEW

In a challenging year, WFP reached **1.24 MILLION** beneficiaries with food and nutrition assistance, among them families hit hard by the COVID-19 pandemic. Supporting the government-led response, WFP transported vital medical equipment and supplies, including vaccines, oxygen and test kits. While continuing with regular operations, including mother and child health and nutrition, school feeding, rice fortification, resilience building and emergency preparedness, WFP also assisted households at risk from flash floods caused by unseasonal October rains. The year ended positively with WFP cementing the Right to Food Act 2018 into the Food Systems Summit Dialogues.




