SCALING UP INTEGRATED RESILIENCE IN THE SAHEL

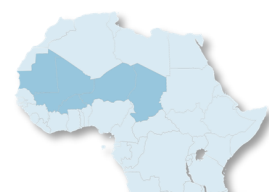
Protracted crises

Complex and protracted crises spill across borders and vulnerable people caught in them are often **facing multiple hardships**. One of these crises unfurls in the Sahel region countries (Burkina Faso, Chad, Mali, Mauritania and Niger), where the current population of about 80 million people is projected to double within the next two decades. **Food insecurity as well as chronic and acute malnutrition are persistently high**, fueled by widespread poverty, escalating conflict and displacement, an environment threatened by land degradation, limited and unequal access to basic services, poorly integrated markets, recurrent episodes of

In practice, this means bringing degraded land back to life, getting children back to school, investing in healthy diets for mothers and children, creating green jobs and opportunities for the youth and building social cohesion throughout entire communities. Crucially, this occurs in the same communities, targeting the same vulnerable people over a period of at least five years.

A long-term and sustainable vision

The programme is based on four core principles:
