EXCHANGE OF LETTERS CONSTITUTING AN AGREEMENT¹ BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA AND THE GOVERNMENT OF ROMANIA ON THE MUTUAL ABOLITION OF VISAS IN DIPLOMATIC AND OFFICIAL PASSPORTS

Excellency,

I have the honour to inform Your Excellency that, in view of the friendly and cooperative relations and for the purpose of facilitating official travel between their respective territories, the Government of Romania is prepared to conclude with the Government of the Republic of Korea an agreement for the mutual abolition of visa requirements for diplomatic and official passports in the following terms:

1. The nationals of Romania and of the Republic of Korea holding a valid diplomatic or official (in case of Romania, official or service) passport may enter the territory of the other country without visa for their stay not exceeding ninety days from the date of their entry.
2. The nationals of each country who, holding a passport referred to in Article 1, are appointed to its diplomatic or consular mission

in the other country, and the members of their family forming part of their household, shall be permitted to enter without visa the territory of the other country and to stay there for the period of their official mission.

3. The nationals of each country who, holding a passport referred to in Article 1, except for the nationals referred to in Article 2, intend to stay more than ninety days in the territory of the other country, are required to obtain a visa in advance. The above-mentioned visa shall be issued free of charge by the diplomatic or consular missions of the other country.
4. The nationals of one country, in case they have lost or damaged their passports, are required to notify the incident to the competent authorities of the other country where they reside. In such cases, the diplomatic or consular mission of the former country shall issue them adequate travel documents, which shall be provided with exit permission by the competent authorities of the other country.
5. The nationals of each country may enter or transit the territory of the other country at any authorized places opened for international passenger traffic.
6. Without prejudice to their privileges and immunities, it is the duty of the holders of diplomatic or official passports to respect during their stay the laws and regulations of the receiving country.
7. Each Government is entitled to deny the entry into or to shorten the period of stay in its territory of the nationals of the other country who are considered unacceptable. In case such shortening
